The Minutes of Special Meeting held May 26, 1953 were read by Mayor and approved by the Commission.

A group of citizens residing at or near the intersection of Homer Blvd. and Fenley Streets, presented a written request to the Council and asked that the Council prevent Bertis L. Wiggins from operating a welding shop and junk yard in this area. They contended that rubbish and wrecken cars sitting in Fenley Street presented a Health Hazard and city street machinery could not maintain this street. On motion of Commissioner Gipson and seconded by Commissioners Collins, all voting "Aye". The Council instructed City Attorney to draw up an injunction against Mr. Wiggins.

Some Negro Citizens appeared before the Council and asked that Keltys Street be surfaced or improved in some way to prevent the dusty condition that they now have. The Council instructed City Manager to prepare estimate on improving the street and instructed the group to contact all citizens on said street, as to their willingness and ability to pay their share of cost.

On motion of Commissioner Gipson, seconded by Commissioner Nerren, all voting "Aye", the Council gave permission to Postmaster R. V. Welch to place a postal collection box on island at the intersection of Lufkin Ave. and Third Street. This collection box to be placed on trial basis, to relieve conjection in front of post office.

² The Council passed on final reading Zone Change request of J. A. Bryan covering Lot 2, Block 2 of the Atkinson Drive Addition. This Zone designation was from "F" to "H" District.

United The Council discussed the closing of Clark Street between Homer Blyd. and Charlton Street. They had no petition from property owners adjoining therefore no action was taken.

Zone Change request of A. A. Zogg, ET UX, for change from "A" District to "H" District on a triangular strip of land on the East Side of Timberland Drive, North of Denman Ave. and West of Montrose Street was passed by the Council for publication, subject to check of the adjacent property owners.

On motion of Commissioner Gipson, seconded by Commissioner Collins, all voting "Aye", the Gouncil agreed to accept no further additions to the City of Lufkin unless the additions were provided with utilities. Surface that the There being no further business, the meeting duly adjourned.
