

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE CITY
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS HELD
SEPTEMBER 1st, A.D. 1939. //

Be it remembered that on this 1st day of September A.D. 1939, there was begun and holden a Special Meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

R. C. Arnett, absent on account of his business required his attention at that time. oOo

1. Jack McDermott, Curtis Metcalf, T. J. Mankin, J. L. Crawford, W. C. Binion, and W. D. Abernathy, members of Air Port Committee, were present and discussed the possibility of the City of Lufkin sending a Representative Mr. Stine, or Curtis W. Fenley, to Washington, D. C. to see if they couldn't persuade the Air Line Committee to designate Lufkin as a part of their Air-Line Route between Houston, Texas, and Shreveport, La. They also requested that city vote \$150.00 to defray the expense of this trip. Mr. Stine, ask the Atty. if it was legal for the City to vote payment of this expense since it was not in the budget--he was advised that it was. Mr. Stine ask if it wouldn't be proper for the Air Line to pay the expense--McDermott explained that it didn't make any difference to the Air Lines what town was designated as a stopping point. W. D. Winston made motion that city pay not over \$150.00 for the expense to Washington, D. C. J. E. Jay, seconded the motion. The Mayor put the question and all Voted "AYE". The Mayor voted "NO". oOo

2. Curtis explained to the council that he had mailed out several hundred letters concerning Delinquent City Taxes, and that they were to come in and see him about them within the 10 days, but if Council wanted him to make the trip to Washington, he would gladly do so. oOo

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned. oOo
