1. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

2. Mr. Stine stated that he had the figures on cost to install Remote Control System at the New Water Well in the amount of \$542.40, but requested that City Council wait awhile longer before having same installed.

- 3. Mr. Stine read letter from H. A. Hayley, in regard to Policy on the Volunteer Firemen carried by the City, and stated that he would appreciate some of the business. Council authorized City Manager to investigate the Insurance carried by the City by the different agents, and see if it was all equally divided in proportion to City Taxes paid in.
- μ Dr. E. T. Clark, present in regard to valuation put on his Building by the 1939 Board of Equalization. He stated that he was out of town at the time he was to appear before the Tax Board and didn't get to see them to protest the raise in valuation. Mayor and City Council stated that they would wait until all the others that were to complain--make their complaint--and would work them all out at the same time.

5 W. D. Winston made a motion that City not to Run any Water or Sewer lines through the Sharpe & Stevenson Addition to the City of Lufkin, until City was paid in full for the lines already installed. R. C. Arnett, seconded the motion. The Mayor put the question to a vote. "All voted "AYE" Noes--None.

J. P. Coons, present, and stated that he had secured almost all the Signatures-giving city of Lufkin Right-Of-Way for street through the Lane now used by the Public from the Huntington Highway East Side of the two-Point Filling Station around by the Second Baptis Church-connecting Huntington Highway with Church Street and Lufkin Avenue.

Mayor and City Council authorized City Manager to kook into same and see what the cost to the city to improve this as a street.

- 7. A. E. Mantooth, present in regard to pit toilets on his property, built according to State and City of Lufkin, Texas, requirements and specifications—and since the City destroyed them, he feels as though the City has mistreated him because there is about 100 closer to the business district than his—and request that City pay for toilets torn up and reimburse him for house rent lost by tenants having to move.

 Mr. Stine stated that he did not recall giving orders to destroy toilets on Mr. Mantooth's property, but did send some of the City men up to destroy some toilets for Curtis W. Fenley adjoining A. E. Mantooth's property—at the request of Mr. Fenley, and that if he did give the orders to destroy the above property—he would gladly reimburse Mrs. Mantooth for damages himself.
