The following proceedings were had to-wit:

1. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

2. R. A. Corbett present protesting issuance of Taxicab license to various parties.

3. E. J. Conn, Atty. representing Ollie Strain, Applicant for Taxi-cab license and stated that his client was ready to cooperate with City ordinance, and was willing to make Bond on all of his Taxies to protect the public against any damage if the city council saw fit. Lewis Hicks made motion to hold same up until the Bond question could be investigated, and would probably take same up at the next council meeting on the 8th or 9th.

Tom Coleman, Jr., County Atty., presented a request from Gordon-Sewall, of Houston, Texas, requesting permission from City Council to erect Building in Fire Zone (Not Fire Proof) same to be Sheet Iron, and also to have a Sprinkler System. They wanted to locate same at the rear of the Temple Lumber Co. next to cotton platform. It was agreed to hold same up until next council meeting.

1. H. G. Kornegay, Citizen and Tax Payer, present, and request that City investigate the condition of his street; also that he did not have any Fire protection, and that his property was valued for taxes the same % as property with fire protection and a good street, City Manager was requested to investigate same and repair street.

2. Marvin Nichols, representing the Firm of Freese & Nichols, Eng., in regard to the Sewer Lift Station. Mr. Nichols, stated that the plant was designed to go in the middle of the road, and that the plans were approved by P.W.A and also the City Council, and after same was approved it was decided not ot install Lift station in Road. Mr. Stine stated that he requested Mr. Streiber, Rep. of Freese & Nichols, install motors top of the ground. Mr. Nichols, said that he didn't see why Streiber didn't change it, because they were sending in change orders all along. He also stated that the City went on sewer service the 12th of May to the 15th of November, and that Mr. Owens was at Lift station Late Sunday Afternoon, Nov. 13th, and was phoned Tues. Eve. 15th about the lift station. Some of the neighbors stated that a Mrs. Largent had trouble all day with her electric service, and that a new fuse was put in the Transformer, and it later burned out. When Fuse burned out in transformer, it left a single phase circuit on these motors, and doesn't know if motors started or not, and that sometime during Tues. Night water got above swith boxes and burned out, and would insist that city get the res. service off of City Power Transformer. He also stated that there might be another explanation for same (bent float was found) The City Atty. asked, "who designed the Lift Station"? Mr. Nichols that they haven't been able to find anyone to say that the design of station was cause of trouble, but the fact that same was under-ground made more expense, and under contract, they were not responsible. He said that since cost of Station above ground was \$200.00

he was willing to pay \$100.00 of the cost. City atty. stated that since ~~City~~ Freese & Nichols was representing City of Lufkin, that we were depending upon them to install same to the best interest of the City. It was agreed to let Mr. C. L. Wtine and Mr. Nichols settle the matter as they saw fit.

Accounts and bills due by the City to various parties, firms and corporation, were presented for payment and it appearing that such or said bills as had been properly audited and approved for payment by the City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried were ordered paid.

A motion was made by W. D. Winston and seconded by J. E. Jay that the class of building that Gordon-Sewall desired to build in Fire Zone be rejected. (Fire Zone not to be changed) The Mayor put the question to a vote---all voted "Aye" "Noes" none.
