Glenn, Mayor be authorized to execute such contracts as may be recommended by the City Attorney. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Stevenson and Mrs. Eva Sharpe were present and requested the City to senstruct 1000 feet of water line and 1000 feet of sewer line into a new addition being developed by them adjoining the City Park in the South part of the City and partly outside of the City limits of the City, also to grub and grade a steet 35 feet in width in said addition They agreed that the City might have approximately 7,000 feet of timber which could be sold and amount received applied to the cost of grading the street. The matter was passed without action, other than to approve the layout of streets and the map showing the addition and dedication of same.
