There came up for discussion and consideration the matter of securing from the United Gas Corporation a financial statement showing receipts and for their last fiscal year; disbursements as effecting the Lufkin Franchise only//letting such statement show as much detail as possible that will reflect the total investment in Lufkin. The purpose of such statement to be for information to the City Commission in order that they may determine if the rate now being charged in Lufkin is excessive or not. J. E. Jay made a motion that the Mayor be authorized to make official request of the United Gas Corporation to furnish the statement as outlined in the first part of this paragraph. The motion was seconed by R. C. Arnett. The question was put by the mayor and the following is the recorded vote on same: "Ayes" - W. M. Glenn, W. D. Winston, Jr., Lewis Hicks, R. C. Arnett and J. E. Jay. "NOES" - None. Whereupon the mayor declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.
