

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE

TEXAS, HELD AUGUST 2nd, A.D. 1939.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of August, 1939, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:

1. Herbert Roper, R. A. McCarley, W. A. Averitt, and et al were present, representing the Painters & Carpenters Unions. and they stated that the Ordinance Against Labor Picketing looked like a slap at Organized Labor. Mayor Glenn stated that while he did not vote for the Ordinance--it was not the intention of the City Commission to hurt any Organized Labor.

2. City Manager stated that they had discussed the Value of City property, and list it as follows:

4. Mayor Glenn read bids to Move R. L. Brown House and Outhouses, bids listed as follows: A. G. Perry \$575.00, M. Ivy \$219.00. The contract was let to M. Ivy for \$219.00, and was requested that M. Ivy make Bond for Faithful Performance of Contract. The Motion was made by Lewis Hicks to give same to M. Ivy, and seconded by R. C. Arnett. The Mayor put the question and it carried unanimously.


