MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD APRIL 25, 1940.

The City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in special session on this the 25th day of April A.D. 1940, after due notice had been given in writing of such meeting, and after all of the Commissioners had waived and accepted service of such notice, with the following members present:

The Mayor then declared the ordinance passed on first reading.

The Ordinance is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION TO PARK OR LEAVE STANDING ANY VEHICLE UPON THE EAST SIDE OF SOUTH ANGELINA STREET IN THE CITY OF LUFKIN, ANGELINA COUNTY, TEXAS ADJACENT TO THE WEST SIDE OF LOTS NUMBER ONE ~~TO~~ SIX, BLOCK NUMBER FOUR OF THE ORIGINAL TOWN OF LUFKIN REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, FIXING THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF AFFIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS:


SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or leave standing any vehicle on the East side of South Angelina Street in the City of Lufkin, Angelina County, Texas adjacent to the West side of Lots Number One ~~and~~ Six, Block Number Four of the original town of Lufkin;

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the terms of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not less than ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00) nor more than TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00);

SECTION 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed;


SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

2. City Manager Stine stated that he wanted to discuss with the Commission the first draft of the budget for the year 1940. He explained that the pump to the water well had been lowered forty (40) feet and that the production had been increased by one hundred (100) gallons per minute. This was done in order to see if it will be necessary to include in the budget a sum of money for the drilling of another well or connecting with the Paper Mill supply. He also went over a number of items in his tentative budget relative to the proposed new city hall, swimming pool, golf course, and other major items. It was decided for the present that Mr. Stine should include an amount in the budget for special improvements which would either be used for a city hall or a new water well, whichever was deemed most necessary by the Commission.

3. The matter of the request of L. L. Biggs to make Kaiser Street a twenty (20) foot street instead of a forty (40) foot street was discussed, and the written consent of all of the property owners abutting on said street was presented to the Council (such written consent can be found at another page of these Minutes).

4. Commissioner G. E. Barington introduced a resolution and moved that it be passed; seconded by Commissioner W. D. Winston, Jr., and carried by the following vote;

The Mayor then declared the resolution passed.

The resolution is as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, AT A MEETING AT WHICH ALL OF THE COMMISSIONERS AND MAYOR WERE PRESENT, AND A QUORUM BEING PRESENT, THAT:

Mayor W. M. Glenn, as such mayor, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to execute the City's quitclaim deed to T. W. McMullen, Sarah A. Donaldson, Mrs. Arch Campbell, Mrs. Happy Daniels, L. L. Biggs and R. J. Behanon, the abutting property owners on Kaiser Street, said deeds to convey ten (10) feet off of each side of said street to the said respective property owners, and said deeds to retain and except from such conveyance a twenty (20) foot street.

Be it further resolved by said City Commission that the consideration for such conveyance shall be the agreement on the part of the respective grantees that such twenty (20) foot strip reserved and accepted by the City shall at all times be kept free of all obstructions, and that the right-of-way of said street to such twenty (20) foot for water, sewer and other purposes shall be protected and shall remain as originally granted by the map or plat of said street which is of record in the Deed Records of Angelina County, Texas with reference to the original width of said street.

PASSED AND APPROVED this the 25th day of April A.D. 1940.


5. Commissioner J. E. Jay stated that he was of the opinion that some definite action should be taken as to the claim of that some definite action should be taken as to the claim of

Policeman Ike Turner for injuries incurred by him, but the matter was passed without any action.


There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was upon motion duly made and carried, adjourned.
