). The minutes of the precedings maetings held during the month of May were read, approved and adopted as read, with the exception of the minutes of the meeting of May 7th which were corrected to show that C. L. Johnson instead of Grady Johnson appeared in regards to his taxes.

2. Mrs. Happy Daniels appeared before the Commission in behalf of an application of the Gulf Oil Company for a permit to erect a filling station on the corner of South First Street and Menefee Street. Mrs. Daniels stated that she had a sale for a lot for a filling station, but that the offer was only good lif she was allowed to build a filling station and, she did not state the price for Which she could sell the lot. It appearing that there were several objections filed and to be filed to the granting of the permit, a special meeting was ordered to be held Friday afternoon, June 7th at three o'clock p.m. at which time all objections could be heard.

3. Mr. C. F. Woods appeared and asked the City for \$132.85, this amount being the extra costs of sewer connections to his house on Jefferson Street **bocks**ioned by the fact that the sewer main in front of his property was not deep enough in the ground to accommodate his house. The matter was deferred until the next meeting in order that it could be investigated.

4 Mr. Dawson, District Supervisor for Old Age Assistance appeared again requesting more room for his work, and W. D. Winston, Jr., G. ^E. Barington and C. L. Stine were appointed as a committee to investigate and report to the Council on Friday June 7th

S Charlie Ragland appeared in reference to the taxes on the old Herrick Place and offered to pay taxes, penalties and interest based upon a \$300.00 valuation. The Council accepted this offer upon Mr. Ragland's statements that he intended to connect with the City Sewer System and to either remodel the house or to tear it down and build a new daplex apartment.

6. Mr. Stine reported that the City had an offer to buy a second hand Ford car for \$600.00 and recommended that this purchase be made.
