RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PASS ORDINANCE SUBMITTING AMENDMENTS TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, AND DE-CLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LURKIN, TEXAS: 1. That it is the intention of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas to pass an ordinance on the 3rd day of September, 1940, submitting and providing for the submission to the qualified voters of the City of Lufkin, amendments to the charter of said city, all in accordance with the Home Rul Amendment to the Constitutuion of the State of Texas, and with the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Texas, and in accordance with any applicable provisions of the City Charter.

- 2. That the Mayor of the City of Lufkin is directed to give notice of the intention to pass such ordinance by publication in accordance with the applicable provisions of the acts of the Legislature of the State of Texas and particularly in accordance with the provisions of Article 1171 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925.
- That there exists a necessity for amendments to the charter of the City of Lufkin to enable At to better and more expeditiously improve its public streets, make them more sanitary and safer to the public, and such facts constitute an emergency requiring that thie resolution be passed as an emergency measure and same is accordingly so passed and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
