[. Commissioner J. E. Jay introduced an ordinance canvassing

2. Commissioner H. E. Jay introduced an ordinance suspending certain provision of the building code for the duration of the war, and moved that it be placed on second and final reading, seconded by Commissioner Cary C. Trevathan and carried by the following vote:

CARRIED: Ordinance placed on second and final reading.

CARRIED. Ordinance passed second and final reading. This ordinance immediately follows these minutes.

3. Captain W. E. White of the Texas Defense Guard was present and requested that the Council release the Junior Chamber of Commerce from its obligation to pay for an air raid siren for the city in order that they could use those funds for the benefit of the Defense Guard.

Upon motion of Cary C. Trevathan, seconded by James A. Abney, such obligation was released and the order for the siren was ordered cancelled, all commissioners present voting "YEA".

4. The bills for the month of March were read and approved and ordered paid.


5. Voucher number 20 from Koch & Fowler for \$1000.00 for engineering services on paving unit number 2 was allowed and ordered paid.


