being present, and the following absent: Cary C. Trevathan, constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

- Mr. Barnes, of the War Department was present with Mr. W. R. Beaumier, Chamber of Commerce. Mayor Glenn announced that the meeting was called for the purpose of extending the City Sanitary Sewer Main out highway 69 to the Forestry Headquarters for the purpose of serving the proposed training project of the War Department. After discussion, Mr. Kelley reported that the estimated cost of the extension was \$2,033.79.
 - Q. Upon motion of R. E. Melvin, Seconded by Jas. A. Abney, the extension of the above 6" main was authorized provided the War Department actually makes the improvements and additions contemplated. All commissioners present voted Yea.
 - Jupon motion of B. F. Milligan, seconded by Jas. A. Abney, with all commissioners present voting Yea, a payment of \$25.00 was authorized to pay deficit on expenses of Rationing Board, provided the County pays a like amount.
 - An Upon motion of R. E. Melvin, Seconded by Jas. A. Abney, with all commissioners present voting Yea, a renewal of the lease of the Old Wilson Home to N. Y. A. was approved subject tonew provisions to be included in Contract prepared by City Attorney and approved by City Manager. Also included in the motion was authority for City Manager to execute the Lease.
 - Mr. Kelley reported that the NYA had refused to furnish help to take care of Community Center Building and that he was arranging for Henry Finley to take care of it for an additional \$25.00. This action was approved

being furnished for the Housekeeping Aid projects and was instructed to continue as heretofore until formal acti n by Council.

There being nothing further to come before the meeting, it was, upon motion duly made and seconded, adjourned.
