

MINUTES OF Regular MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD October 5th
1943 AT 7:30 .PM.

On this the 5th day of October, A. D. 1943,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in
Regular session, in the regular meeting place in said
City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

being present, and the following absent:

constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. Minutes of meetings held during the month of September were read and regularly approved.

2. Motion was made by Jas. A. Abney, second by B.F. Milligan and passed by all members voting yea, approving the transfer of \$6,280.68 from General Fund account to Interest and Sinking Fund account for the purchase of \$5,000.00 in City Bonds of 1936-A issue which would mature March 15th 1954, and unearned Interest Coupons.

3. Steve Harmon, Manager of Chamber of Commerce, together with J.O. Burnside and E.L. Bartlett appeared in the interest of Fire prevention week and also a proposed clean-up campaign and were assured that the City would co-operate fully in these campaigns.

4. Pat Scoggins outlined a campaign for killing rats in the City and requested the City provide as much as \$300.00 for the purchase of poison and other material needed in the campaign, which would be directed by the Federal Wild Life Association.

5. On motion by R.E. Melvin second by Arthur Temple, Jr. the expenditure of \$300.00 was authorized, R.E. Melvin, Arthur Temple, Jr. and B.F. Milligan voting yea and Jas. A. Abney voting nay.

6. R.C. Chancey, chief of police and Henry Kelton, policeman were present and were questioned by the Commission in regard to a difficulty between them.

7. After they had left the room the matter was discussed and motion was made by B.F. Milligan, second by Jas. A. Abney that services of both be dispensed with.

On vote called for by the Mayor, B.F. Milligan, Arthur Temple, Jr. and Jas. A. Abney voted yea and R.E. Melvin and W.M. Glenn voted nay. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

8. No further business was presented and the meeting was adjourned.
