MINUTES OF Regular MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD May 4th  
1943 AT 7:30 PM.

On this the 4th day of May, A. D. 1943,  
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in  
Regular session, in the regular meeting place in said  
City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. Minutes of all meetings held during the month of April  
were read and regularly approved.

2. Mr. J. B. Nabers, District Engineer for the State Highway  
Department addressed the Commission on the proposition of  
making plans for Highway construction as a Post War measure,  
referring particularly to the matter of a new out let through  
the City as discussed immediately before the war.

3. The matter was discussed thoroughly and motion was made  
by Jas. A. Abney, second by Arthur Temple, Jr., that the  
City Manager make a study and endeavor to locate the two  
best routes through the City for consideration. The motion  
carried by all voting yea.

4. Tom Melton requested the City pay Hubbard & Melton for  
approximately 18' x 333' of land which they claim is owned  
by them and which is used by the City in Chestnut Street.

5. Motion was made by Arthur Temple, second by Jas. A. Abney  
that K. Morgan, A. E. Mantooth and Judson Coward be ap-  
pointed to investigate the matter and report to the Commission  
as to how much, if any, of the land in question is in use by  
the City and how much, if any, the City should pay Hubbard &  
Melton for it. The motion carried by all voting yea.

6. Mr. Kelley recommended that Summer rates be offered, as  
have been here-to-fore and motion was made by B. F. Milligan,  
second by Arthur Temple, Jr., that Summer rates be offered  
on same basis as here-to-fore. The motion carried by all  
members voting yea.

7. Mr. Kelley reported the need of a Scarifier machine for  
use in Oiling City Streets and motion was made by B. F.  
Milligan second by Arthur Temple, Jr. authorizing Mr.  
Kelley rent a machine, cost not to exceed \$50.00, the motion  
carried by all voting yea.

Nothing further was presented  
for attention and the meeting adjourned.
