This meeting was called for the purpose of opening bids on one motor grader, one concrete mixer and 350 linear feet of steel curb and gutter forms. The following bids were opened: For Concrete mixer: &For Motor Grager: Browning Ferris Machinery Co-----\$ 7,277.45 Gulf Tractor and Equipment Co----- 7,802.65 For Curb and Gutter Forms: Browning Ferris Machinery Co.----\$
Metal Forms Corporation-----\$

Upon recommendation of the City Manager, it was decided to reject all bids on the Concrete Mixer, pending further investigation.

It was then moved by D. M. Thrash and seconded by B. F. Milligan to buy an Adams Grader from Browning Ferris Machine Co. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

- Motion was then made by D. M. Thrash and seconded by B. F. Milligan to purchase the straight concrete forms from Browning Ferris and Radius Forms from Contractors Equipment Sales. The motion carried by unanimous vote.
- It was further moved by B. F. Milligan and seconded by D. M. Thrash to purchase one Fordson Tractor with dirt-loader and weed-cutting attachments, from the Lufkin Tractor Company. The motion carried by unanimous vote.
- Mr. I. L. Satterfield from the Post Office was present and stated that delivery service was to be extended in the City and that it was his recommendation to change the names of some of the City Streets as there was some confusion in identifying them because of similarity of names. He was told that the City would corporate with the Post Office Department in the matter.
