MINUTES OF Called MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD September 25  
1946 AT 4:00 P. M.

On this the 25 day of September, A. D. 1946,  
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in

being present, and the following absent: B. F. Milligan and D. M. Thrash

constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:  
This meeting was called for the purpose of conferring with the joint  
City-County Airport Advisory Board in regards to applying for  
Federal aid for Airport improvements. Members of the Board present  
were: Messrs. D. W. Thompson, W. R. Beaumier, Glenn Burgess and  
Dexter Satterwhite. The subject was discussed at length and decided  
that since the County already had a fund for Airport Improvement and  
the City did not, that it would be better to make application for aid  
on the County port.

It was moved by L.C. Martin and seconded by E. A. Gibbs to pay all City  
Employees using their private-owned cars in connection with their  
work \$60.00 (sixty dollars) per month, beginning October 1, 1946,  
and at no time would the City furnish gas, oil or repairs for these  
cars. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

Wednesday, October 9, 1946, at 4:00 P. M. was set for date of  
public hearing on Zone change application for Jack Nerren.

It was moved by E. A. Gibbs and seconded by L. C. Martin to sell portion  
of lot 24, Block 4, N. Montrose addition to Gus Theobald and that a  
resolution be drawn authorizing same.

No further business was presented, so the meeting adjourned.
