On this twenty-sixth day of August, 1947, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas met in a called meeting in the regular meeting place in the said City of Lufkin with the following members, thereof, to-wit:

being present and none absent, thus constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:


1. This meeting was called for the purpose of discussing the policy of breaking curbs to allow parking space. The subject was discussed at length, after which it was moved by G. W. Roland and second by D. M. Thrash that in the future when a building is to be constructed, and the owner request that the curb be omitted, that such request not be granted unless all buildings be placed at least thirty feet (30') from the street right-of-way line so that any vehicle parked on the lot would not obstruct any part of the sidewalk or side walk area. The motion carried by all members voting yea.

2. It was then moved by D. M. Thrash and second by G. W. Roland that the City borrow \$2,000.00 (two thousand dollars) for the purpose of purchasing lots 6 and 7 block 2 of the Oakland addition for the purpose of erecting a fire station. The motion carried by unanimous vote of yea and commissioner Roland and the City Secretary were authorized to make the purchase.

No further business was presented so the meeting adjourned.
