MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD OCTOBER 21, 1952, at 7:30 P. M.

On this the 21st day of October, A. D., 1952, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in Regular Session in the regular meeting place in said City, with the following members thereof being present:

and Jack Nerren, Commissioner Ward No. 2 being absent: a quorum being present, the following business was transacted:

I The minutes of the regular meeting held on the 7th day of October, 1952, were read and approved by the City Commission.

2 Mr. Royle and Mr. Daugherty, residents of Alton Street appeared in behalf of the drainage problem taken up at the previous meeting. It was discussed by the residents and the Commission relative to paving and drainage of two blocks of said street, and was finally agreed, as a temporary measure to reopen old channel South of Laurel Street in order for the excess water to drain off, instead of backing up on complainants property.

³ Mr. Gene Marshall of the Texas Forest Service presented the Master Plan covering improvements to the City Lake and Jones Lake and surrounding areas under the 10 year lease to the Forestry Committee and the Angelina Chamber of Commerce. The Master Plan was studied by the Commission and all agreed that it was a very worthy project. Commissioner Zeagler made motion that Master Plan be adopted, which was seconded by Commissioner Stegall. All voted "Aye." The Mayor executed 10 year lease to the Forestry Commission and the Angelina Chamber of Commerce. Original copy of the Master Plan attached hereto.

4 Final approval was passed on Zone Change from "A" to "B" District of East 30' of Lot 6 and Lot No. 1 of Block 16, of the Bon Ton Addition to the City of Lufkin, whereby Church of Christ, could erect church building.

⁵ The Commission of the City of Lufkin went on record as being opposed to the Amendment to be voted on November 4, 1952, whereby the State Legislation would grant Cities the right to carry their own Workmen's Compensation.

There being no further business to come before the Commission the meeting was adjourned.
