

5. Bids were opened on the purchase of two two-ton trucks, as previously advertised, and were as follows:

Medford Company - - - - \$4220.00
Southland Buick Company - - - - 4824.00
Angelina Chevrolet Company - - - 4137.00
S. C. Mitchell Motor Company - - - 4368.48
Berry Motor Company - - - - - 4176.00
Squyres Incorporated - - - - - 4200.00.

Angelina Chevrolet Company being the lowest and best bidder, it was agreed to purchase the two trucks from such company.

6. Mr. Elwyn Gipson appeared before the Commission and requested action in widening and straightening Lufkin Avenue. He submitted a petition with 264 signatures requesting action by the City Commission on such project. He stated at least half the property owners would donate right-of-way, and that his committee would obtain the options for the remaining right-of-way. Robert Denum was named Chairman of this right-of-way committee and he was instructed to represent the City in getting options for such right-of-way.

7. It was agreed by the Commission that the Fire Chief and one assistant attend the firemens' training school at A&M. College from July 11 to the 16th.

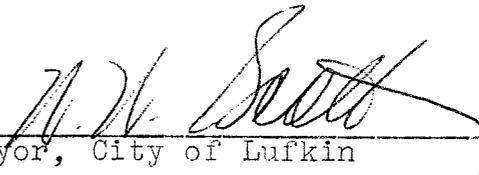
8. Mr. Walter Still, Sr. was appointed to serve on the Equalization Board in the place of Mr. Ed Wareing who resigned such place.

10. The Commission voted to accept the audit as prepared by J. L. Spotten and Company and authorized Mr. Sherrill, the City Manager, to negotiate with Mr. Spotten to do a quarterly audit for the fiscal year.

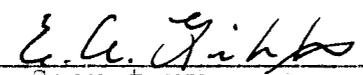
11. The Commission passed on first reading the adoption of the U. S. Public Health Milk Ordinance, as recommended by the State Health Department.
