MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITM COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS HELD ON JUNE 1, A.D. 1954, at 7:30 P.M.

On this the lst day of June A. D. 1954, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in Regular Session at the City Hall in said City with the following members thereof being present:

1. The meeting was opened with prayer by Mayor Woodrow W. Scott.

2. Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on May 18, were read and approved.

3. Mr. Brown appeared before the commission representing people that live on Scarbough Street. They wanted to know what Mr. Sayers would do regarding opening this street thru his sisters property. Mayor Scott had talked with Mr. Sayers and he was not in favor of donating or either selling this property. Mayor Scott agreed to get Mr. Bargainer and look into the drainage problem on this street.

4. Ned Shand appeared representing the Lufkin Independent School District, wanting a portion of Pierce Street that runs thru the school property in Wood Addition closed. It was agreed to close the Pierce Street, the portion that runs thru school property.

5. The purchase of the Satterfield property was discussed an a resolution was passed notifying and conforming the purchase of such property.

6. Bids were opened on a small portion of Land own by the City of Lufkin on Kurth Drive in Track 27, Block 6. Four bids were received as follows.

7. Mr. Jake Holland appeared before the Commission representing Mr. N. A. Massingill on Turner Street regarding complaint about raising chickens. Mr. Holland stated that Mr. Massingill was going to move his chicken house to the North Commer of his property to try to satisfy the ones complaining.

8. It was agreed to have the committee of Angelina County Negro Chamber of Commerce Summer Recreation program appear before the Commission June 15, 1954 and submit their needs and what money will be spent for.

ll. It was agreed to appoint Ross Gipson, Watt Averett, and Ed Wareing to serve on the Board of Tax Equalization for year 1954.

12. It was agreed to instruct R. B. Sherrell, Jr. to hire a mover of his choice to move house hold furnishings from Vernon, Texas to Lufkin, Texas.

13. It was agreed W. F. Collins be appointed Mayor Pro-Tens

14. It was agreed after discussion that Mayor Scott and Mr. Nerren contact five local lawyers to see if they would serve as private investigators for police investigation.

15. There being no further business, the Commission aduourned.
