

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD AUGUST 8,
1957, at 7:30 P. M.

On this the 8th day of August, A. D., 1957,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in
special session, in the regular meeting place in said

the following business was transacted:

1. The meeting was opened with prayer by the Mayor.
2. The City Manager reported that he had tabulated the bids of the various automobile concerns who had bid on the three passenger cars and two pick-up trucks, as previously advertised by the City Commission. Henderson-Medford Motor Company being the lowest and best bidder on the three cars and the two pick-up trucks, such bids were awarded to the Henderson-Medford Motor Company and the City Commission voted to buy such cars and trucks from this concern.
3. The Commission voted to require detailed tax statements of delinquent taxes collected by Morris & Moroney, Attorneys, before payment to them for their fees.
4. Mr. Marion Clay, K. W. Denman, Ned Shands, Jr. and Dr. L. H. Denman appeared before the Commission in the interest of the Lufkin Telephone Exchange, for an increase in telephone rates. After considerable discussion the Commission voted unanimously to reject the increase of rates as proposed by the telephone company. After further discussion, Mayor Parker proposed to increase the rates as follows: One party business telephone to \$11.00 per month, two-party business telephone to \$9.00 per month and one-party residence telephones to \$5.00 per month. The telephone company did not agree to accept such increased rates as suggested by Mayor Parker.
5. There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting adjourned.
