

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD AUGUST 20  
1957, at 7:30 P. M.

On this the 20th day of August, A. D., 1957,  
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in  
regular session, in the regular meeting place in said  
City, with the following members thereof, towit:

the following business was transacted:

1. The meeting was opened with prayer by Mayor S.R. Parker, Jr.
2. The minutes of the Regular Meeting of August 6, and the minutes of the called meeting of August 8, were read and approved.
3. Mr. Carl Garner was spokesman for a committee that appeared before the City Commission and requested that the drainage on a section of Jefferson Street West of Franklin Street be corrected. They were told that the drainage problem was being considered and the same would be attended to at the very earliest moment.
4. Bids were tabulated on the Jones Lake Swimming Pool, and were as follows:  
Lufkin Construction Company, \$25,576.00;  
East Texas Fence Company, \$26,543.00, and Cardinal Pools, Inc., Dallas, Texas, \$22,999.63. Cardinal Pools, Inc. being the lowest and best bidder, the contract was awarded to this concern.
5. Bids were tabulated and read on ditching machines as follows:  
Bartholow Machinery Company of Dallas, \$15,289.00,  
less trade-in of No. 200 wheel type Parsons Trench Linner,  
at \$2,250.00, net bid being \$13,039.00, for a Parsons  
Ditcher No. 155, Trench Liner; Highway Equipment Company,  
Houston, Texas, \$15,925.00, less trade-in value \$2,625.00,  
less 2% cash discount on balance, net bid being \$13,034.00.  
The City Manager recommended the purchase of the Parsons Ditcher, it having a walkashaw engine, being heavier by 1900 pounds, and was considered preferable and a better built ditcher. There being only \$5.00 difference in the bids, the City Manager recommended the purchase of the Parsons Ditcher.
6. The tax ordinance levying the annual advalorem tax for the fiscal year 1957-58 was passed on second and final reading.
7. Change Order No. 2 in the adjusted contract of Wilks, Dake, and

Steed was approved, which amounted to a net increase of \$12,627.08 on such contract.


8. Bills for the month of July were approved and ordered paid.
