On motion of Price see by Longuet & carried that the ELECTION ORDER following Election order be passed

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas, deem it advisable to issue bonds of the said City for the purpose hereinafter mentioned. Therefore, Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of

Lufkin, that an election be held on the 4th day of August A.D. 1908, at the City Station in the City of Lufkin, Texas, submitting the following proposition to the qualified voters of the City of Lufkin, Texas.

Shall the City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of the said City of Lufkin, Texas, in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars payable in Twenty years after date, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum annually, and to levy a tax sufficient to redeem them at maturity, to procure funds with which to extend and improve the water work system of Lufkin, J. W. Longuet hereby appointed manager of the said election.

Said election shall be held under the provisions of Chapter No. 140, Acts of the 26th. Legislature Laws 1899, and only qualified voters who are property tax payers of the said City, shall be allowed to vote.

All legal voters desiring to support the proposition to issue the bonds, shall have printed upon their ballots 'For ISSUANCE OF BONDS', and those opposed shall have printed upon their ballots the words 'AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS'. The manner of holding the election shall be governed by the laws of the state regulating general elections.

A copy of this order, signed by the Mayor of said City, shall serve as a proper notice of said election, and the Mayor is directed to cause said notice to be posted up at the place designated for the holding said election.
