being absent, constituting a quorum, when the following business was transacted:

- 1. In the absence of Nayor Jim Maters and Nayor Pro Tem A. G. Welch, Commissioner Beamon S. Cook presided and meeting was opened with prayer by City Engineer David A. Lawson
- 2. Hinutes of previous meeting were read and approved.
- 3. City Nanager presented sketch of proposed Angelina County Humane Society Animal Shelter on City property across from Ellen Trout Park. Commissioner S. Harry Kerr made motion that site be approved with proper lease agreement being drawn up by City Attorney. Commissioner Jack W. Tucker seconded the motion and a unanimous affirmative vote was recorded.
- 4. City klanager recommended that no action be taken on purchase of Gradall machine from Hi-Way Equipment Company of Houston which was recently demonstrated in Lufkin and terms of purchase set out by Hi-Way Equipment Company and that possibly the necessary appropriation for such machine could be considered when preparing 1964-65 budget. City Commission in agreement with City Manager's recommendation.
- City Manager stated he had received letter from City Manager 5. at Halton City, Texas, regarding operation of bus system and their experience had been very poor. Some discussion was had on our local situation and City Manager was authorized to try and secure interest of anyone desiring to operate a pus system in Lufkin in that franchise is now open.
- 6. City Manager stated that tax collection as of Dec. 1, 1963 was \$163,406.26 as compared to \$146,840.22 as of Dec. 1, 1962.
- 7. Open items were gone over and status developed.
- 8. Commissioner S. Harry Kerr made motion that invoices for month be ordered paid. Commissioner Jack W. Tucker seconded the motion and a unanimous affirmative vote was recorded.
- 9. There being no further business for consideration, meeting was adjourned.
