Minutes of the City Council, Meeting July 30th., 1914.

Be it remembered that on this the 30th, day of July A. D. 1914, there came on and was held a Special call meeting of the City Council of the City of Lufkin, in the Council Chambers of said City, there being present and presiding the following officers:

When the following proceedings among others were had to-wit:

The object of the meeting as explained by Mayor Humason being to consider the passage of certain ordinances, and the advisability of ordering an election to determine whether or not this City shall issue bonds for the extension and improvement of its water works system, and for the construction and improving its roads and streets, and to attend to such other matters as may properly come before the Council.

Proposition road from Mr. S. J. Treadwell praying for an extension of the water mains up Williams street to serve his residence both for water and fire protection, stating he would pay the cash necessary for this extension, providing further the City would reimburse him with water receipts in the ratio of two for one for every dollar he thus expended.


Motion carried that the matter be tabled until the election for a bond issue be determined.

It was unanimously carried that this city order an election to be held to determine whether or not this City shall issue bonds in the following amounts: \$40,000 street improvement, \$10,000 Fire department improvement, and \$25,000 water works improvement, and the City Secretary is hereby instructed to co-operate with the City attorney in have the election order drawn up in a legal manner.

There being no further business a motion was carried to adjourn.
