Minutes of the City Council, Meeting October 31st, 1914.

Be it remembered that on this the 31st., day of October A. D. 1914, there came on and was held a Call meeting of the City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas, there being present and presiding the following officers:

When the following proceedings among others were had to-wit:

"The object of the meeting being to consider, accept or reject the proposals for the construction of a concrete spillway, which were opened in open Council this morning, and to attend to such other business as may properly come before this council.

After much discussion a motion was put by ^{alderman} Dr. Talor, seconded by alderman Glenn, which said motion was carried by all the aldermen voting aye that all bids be rejected, and that the City Engineer be instructed to advertise for bids again, acting in the same capacity as he did in the former instance.

Mr. Grant Hornaday appeared before the Council in further placing his proposition of a filter system for this town before the Council, offering some valuable suggestions, and making the City the proposition that he would "Deliver to this City the following items for its bond issue of \$21,000.00:

Bledsee, make a tour of investigation visiting in particular the towns of Kaufman, Brownwood, and Ballinger, and report to this Council the result of his investigation so far as the City of Lufkin's interests may appear, at his first possible moment.

There being no further business a motion was carried to adjourn.
