

Lufkin Texas Dec. 4th 1917

The City Council of the City of Lufkin Texas met in regular session on the above date Dec. 4th 1917 with the following officers present, viz;

K. Morgan mayor presiding, S. W. Hawthorne
W. D. Price and W. N. Cook, Aldermen
R. P. Walker Secretary and S. H. Townsend City attorney
when the following orders were made.

The reports of K. Morgan, mayor, J. S. Cockman
marshal, R. P. Walker Secretary and W. L. Sullivan
sanitary inspector were read and approved

The resignation of A. O. Reed as pound master
and Deputy city marshal was accepted by the
Council and the office of pound master and
Deputy city marshal being declared vacant
the application of O. C. Stewart for the office of
pound master and Deputy city marshal was read
and accepted and the said O. C. Stewart was
appointed by K. Morgan mayor to fill the office
of Pound master and Deputy city marshal in and
for the city of Lufkin Texas and said appointment
was confirmed by a vote of the City Council

and the said O.C. Stewart was declared
pound master and Deputy City Marshal in and
for the City of Lufkin Texas.

The application of S. H., G. E. + W. J. Townsend
asking the City of Lufkin Texas to deed them a
part of the alley in Block 8 for a part of Lot 6
in said Block 8 was read and a Committee
consisting of R. Morgan mayor, S. W. Hawthorne
and W. D. Price, aldermen was appointed to
investigate the proposition and make the
exchange of the property as asked for if they
see it to be for the best interest for all parties
concerned to do so.

The report of A. O Reed as pound master
was referred to the mayor.

It is ordered that R. Morgan mayor be
paid \$75.00 out of the water works incidental
fund for his services working on the water
system from Oct. 17th to Nov. 17th 1917

There being no further business before the
Council it was moved and seconded that
the Council adjourn and it was so ordered
