

Lufkin Texas July 3<sup>d</sup> 1917

The City Council of the City of Lufkin Texas met in Regular Session on the above date with the following named officers present; K. Morgan mayor presiding, W. D. Price, S. W. Hawthorne W. D. Newsom aldermen, R. P. Walker Secretary Dr. W. W. Dunn City health officer and Chas. Ellis Pound master when the following orders were made Moved by S. W. Hawthorne and seconded by W. D. Price that a water works Labor fund be created and that not less than Two Hundred and seventy five dollars per month be placed in said fund and it is further ordered that W. L. Jones water commissioner of the City of Lufkin Texas place Two Hundred and seventy five dollars of the funds collected by him for water during the month of June 1917 in said Water Works Incidental and Labor fund and it is further ordered that he the said W. L. Jones place Three Hundred and twenty five dollars of the funds collected by him for water during the month of June 1917 in the Fire Engine fund of the city and the balance so collected by him for water in the water works operating fund of the city

Moved and seconded by W. D. Price and W. D. Newsom that the Steam Boiler, Pump, fixtures &c be moved from the old city pond to the New city pond and that W. L. Jones and the water committee attend to having them moved at once.

Moved and seconded that the secretary make out a bill against the Angelina County Lumber Co. or Angelina & Neches River Railroad Company for Fifty Barrels of oil at \$1.61 per barrel, \$80.50 and present same for payment.

Moved and seconded and so ordered that the City Attorney of the City of Lufkin Texas draw an ordinance authorizing a levy of four cents on the one hundred valuation of property within the City limits of the city of Lufkin Texas to be designated as a park tax in and for said City.

It is ordered that the secretary draw a warrant against the city of Lufkin Texas in favor of the American La France Fire Engine Co. payable out of the Fire Engine fund for the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars

There being no further business The Council adjourned subject to the call of the mayor
