

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD JANUARY 19th, 1921.

This day the City Commission met in call session, said call being made by the Mayor, G. A. Kelley, and after roll call, it appearing that all members of the City Commission being present, the purpose of said call was read to the Commission, after which the following proceedings, were had, to-wit:-

A Resolution approving report and roll filed by City Engineer with reference to improvements to be constructed on Raguet Street, North 1st, Street, Ellis Avenue, Dozier Avenue, Shepherd Avenue, Second Street, Paul Avenue, Angelina Avenue, and Lufkin Avenue, with attached documents, was presented for passage and approval. After same had been read to the City Commission, E. E. Woods made a motion, which was seconded by S. R. Parker, that said resolution be passed and approved. The question was put by the Mayor, who requested all members who favored the passage of said resolution to vote "Aye" and those who opposed to vote "No". The following members voted "Aye"- S. R. Parker, E. E. Woods, B. L. Zeagler and W. B. Treadwell and G. A. Kelley. The following members voted "No"- None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the said resolution passed and approved.

Application was made by A. Stroud for a special permit to build in the fire or brick limits of the city a building of Galvanized Iron, to be used as a storage room for grain feed and its products only. After hearing said application, S. R. Parker made a motion which was seconded by E. E. Woods, that a special permit be granted to the said A. Stroud for the construction of a building as heretofore described. The Mayor put the question, and all members of the City Commission voted "Aye". and the Mayor declared said motion carried.

Application was made by Lufkin Electric Light and Power Company of Lufkin, Texas, for a special permit allowing them to repair an old wooden building in the brick limits of the City of Lufkin, Texas, to be used temporarily for storage of certain machinery, the said Lufkin Electric Light and Power Company promising and obligating themselves to tear away the said old wooden building and construct in its stead a modern fire proof building within two years from this date. Said application having been heard by the City Commission, it was moved by E. E. Woods and seconded by B. L. Zeagler that said special permit be granted upon the terms and conditions as aforesaid. The question having been put by the Mayor, all members voted "Aye". Whereupon the Mayor declared the said motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.
