

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUF-
KIN, HELD JULY 1st, 1921.

On this day the City Commission met in called session with the following members thereof present, to-wit:- G. A. Kelley, Mayor, S. R. Parker Commissioner of Ward No. 1, E. E. Woods, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, B. L. Zeagler, Commissioner of Ward No. 3 and W. B. Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4. J. O. Booker, City Manager and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, were also present, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

A general discussion of ways and means of collecting individual accounts due by parties owning property abutting on streets recently paved for their prorata part of the cost of such paving was entered into. Nothing was definitely agreed upon.

It appearing that by reason of some improvements at the City Reservoir in the way of raising the waste-way whereby increased capacity of said reservoir could be obtained, that the railroad track of the A. & N. R. Railroad would have to be raised, and that such work had already been performed by L. L. Stewart at a cost of \$240.85, it was move and seconded that this amount be paid to said Stewart for said work. Motion carried and warrant ordered issued.

The question of having a meeting of the different officials and employees of the City once each week as a general get-together meeting, at which meeting a general discussion by said officials and employees shall be had relative to the duties of same; reports to be made showing what had been done by each and suggestions offered whereby better service might be ~~prepared~~ had under each department of the City. By move and second duly made and carried such meeting was ordered to be held each Tuesday evening at 7:30 o'clock; and provision made whereby a fine of \$10.00 will be assessed against each official or employee for non-attendance, unless lawfully excused. Motion unanimously carried.

It appearing that quite a lot of dissatisfaction is being had because of the custom of service car owners parking their cars in front of business houses in the City, it was moved by W. B. Treadwell and seconded by S. R. Parker that the City Attorney be instructed to draft an ordinance prohibiting the parking of service cars at any point on Lufkin Avenue ~~from~~ between the intersection of same with Cotton Square and its intersection or crossing on Second Street; also at any point on First Street from its intersection or crossing on Shepherd Avenue and its intersection ~~or~~ crossing of the Alley or opposite same in Blocks Nos 2 and 8; that said ordinance shall also provide for the execution of a good and sufficient bond executed by some reputable Bonding Company by each service car owner operating same within the City Limits of the City of Lufkin, Texas; that said ordinance shall also provide for the payment by each service car owner an annual license fee of \$10000. The motion having been made, the mayor put the question, and each member of the City Commission voted "Aye". and the mayor declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.
