

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN,
TEXAS. HELD AUGUST 7th, 1923.

Be it remembered that on this the 7th day of August, A..D. 1923, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the City Hall in said City. Present and presiding the Hon W. B. Treadwell, Mayor pro tem, Mayor Sam H. Kerr, being absent. Commissioners C. F. Becker, J. W. Lewis, W. A. Behannon and W.B. Treadwell were present, also C. N. Humason, City Manager, T. D. Dunn, City Secretary and W. O. Seale, City Attorney, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of former meetings were read, and by move and second duly made and carried, were adopted as read.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CLOSING THE CROSSING ON THE HOUSTON EAST AND WEST TEXAS RAILWAY ADJACENT TO AND NORTH OF THE MARTIN WAGON COMPANY SAWMILL IN THE NORTHERN PORTION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, SAME BEING A PART OF THE CHOCTAW TRAIL LEADING FROM THE CITY OF LUFKIN TO NACOGDOCHES, TEXAS" was presented for passage and approval on second reading. C. F. Becker made a motion to pass and approve said ordinance on second reading. J. W. Lewis seconded said motion. The Mayor then put the question and requested those commissioners who favored the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye" and those commissioners who opposed the passage of said ordinance to vote "No". The following members voted "Aye" W. B. Treadwell, C. F. Becker, J. W. Lewis and W. A. Behannon. The following members voted "No"- None. Whereupon the mayor declared the Motion carried and the ordinance passed and approved on second and final reading.


