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MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY
OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD
January 1st, 1924.

Be it remembered that on this the 1st day of January, A. D. 1924 there was begun and holden and regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the City Hall in said City; Sam H. Kerr, Mayor, present and presiding, with the following City Officials present: J. W. Lewis, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, W. A. Behannon, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, W. B. Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4. (C. F. Becker, Commissioner of Ward No. 1 being absent). C. N. Humason, City Manager, T. L. Dum, City Secretary and W. O. Seale, City Attorney being present when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of the last meeting read and by move and second duly made and carried were adopted as read.

C. N. Humason, one of the members of a committee appointed to investigate the Bowden Wood yard with reference to its condition from a Sanitary standpoint, reported that such investigation or inspection was made and stated that the owner, Mr. W. T. Bowden, said that just as soon as his present supply of wood was exhausted he did not intend to further use it as such but intended to build a residence on the property. Therefore recommended that no action was required to have same removed.

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CLEANING AND KEEPING CLEAN OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN AND PROVIDING SANITARY RULES AND ABATEMENT OF NUISANCES OF DATE MAY 9TH A. D. 1914 BY ADDING THERETO SECTIONS 34c AND 34d PROHIBITING THE INSTALLING, MAINTAINING AND OPERATING OF A GASOLINE STATION OR AN OIL STATION ON THE SIDE WALK IN THE CITY OF LUFKIN AND PROVIDING PENALTY AND MAKING EACH DAY OF 24 HOURS A SEPARATE OFFENSE FOR VIOLATION THEREOF; REPEALING SECTIONS 34a AND 34b OF SAID ORDINANCE, AND CREATING AN EMERGENCY, was presented for passage and approval as an emergency measure. After due and deliberate consideration of said ordinance it was moved by Commissioner J. W. Lewis and seconded by Commissioner W. B. Treadwell that the rules requiring ordinances to be read and two stated meetings be suspended and this ordinance be placed on second and final reading and be passed and approved and take effect from and after publication. The Mayor then put the question and requested all members of the City Commission who

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avored the motion and the passage of said ordinance to vote Aye and those who opposed same to vote No. The following members voted "Aye" Sam H. Kerr, J. W. Lewis, W. A. Behannon and W. B. Treadwell. The following members voted "no"- None. C. F. Becker was absent and not voting. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance finally passed and approved.

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A petition signed by E. F. Dunlap et als was presented to the City Commission, said petition praying that a street beginning at a point on the East boundary of the City limits and to run in a westerly direction to intersect Chesnut street near the residence of W.L. Evans. After due consideration of said petition by move and second duly made and carried any action on said petition was deferred until such time as proper papers or dedication of said right-of-way for said street is completed.

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Accounts and bills due to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for allowance, and after due consideration of same, it appearing that said accounts as has been properly audited and approved by the City Manager should be paid, by move and second duly made and carried, said accounts were allowed and the City Secretary instructed to issue Warrants to such parties, firms and corporations in payment of said accounts as follows:- Angelina County, \$20.00; J.M. 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AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO PURCHASE FOR THE CITY 26-1/2 ACRES OF LAND OWNED BY E. J. CONN SOUTH OF AND ADJACENT TO THE CITY TO BE USED BY THE CITY FOR A SEWERAGE FARM OR SEPTIC TANKS AND INCENERATORS FOR THE SUM OF \$3,000.00 AS FOLLOWS: \$1,000.00 CASH AND TWO NOTES FOR ONE THOUSAND EACH DUE IN ONE AND TWO YEARS AFTER DATE, BEARING INTEREST FROM DATE UNTIL PAID AT THE RATE OF 8% PER ANNUM, APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS TO CARE FOR THE CASH PAYMENT AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE TWO NOTES OR ASSUMING THE PAYMENT THEREOF, was presented for passage and approval on first reading. J. W. Lewis made a motion and W.A.Behannon seconded same to pass and approve said ordinance on first reading. The Mayor then put the question and requested all members who favored said motion and the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye" and those members who opposed the passage of said to vote "no". The following members voted "Aye", Sam H. Kerr, J. W. Lewis, W.A.Behannon, and W. B. Treadwell. C. F. Becker was absent and not voting. The Mayor declared the motion carried and the said ordinance passed and approved on first reading.

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It appearing that it is necessary to pass the above entitled ordinance on second reading, by move and second duly made and carried this meeting is recessed until January 5th, 1924 for the purpose of passing and approving said ordinance on second reading.

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Pursuant to adjournment on the first day of January A.D. 1924 the City Commission met this day, Jan. 5th, 1924, at the City Hall with the following members present, to-wit:- Sam H. Kerr, Mayor, C.F.Becker, W.A. Behannon and W. B. Treadwell, (J.W.Lewis being absent), C. N. Humason City Manager, T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-
