

MINUTES OF A CALLED MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD JULY 9th, A.D.1925.
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BE IT REMEMBERED that on this the 9th day of July, A.D.1925, there came on and was held a called meeting of the Honorable City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, in the City Hall of said city, there being present and presiding the following officers; (Dr.) J.W.Hawkins, Mayor; Joe C.Denman, Commissioner of Ward No.1; A.M.Walker, Commissioner of Ward No.2; W. A.Behannan Commissioner of Ward No.3, and E.W.Leach, Commissioner of Ward No.4; C.N.Humason, City Manager, and W.O.Seale (Atty) acting as Secretary Pro.Tem. in the absence of the Secretary who is ill, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

The Mayor announced the purpose of the meeting was to receive and examine bids for the construction of the city's new sewerage disposal plant and sewerage lines, in accordance with the advertisement for bids to be submitted on this date, and further to award the contract for the construction thereof.

The following persons, firms and corporation had represented and submitted their sealed bids therefor as follows:

L.L.Winans, 2824 Travis Ave., Fort Worth, Texas,	\$81,195.00;
Dellene Construction Co., 404 Magnolia Bldg., Dallas, -Texas,	\$79,376.14
Chas.K.Horton, 2202 Clay Ave., Houston, Texas,	\$92,972.43
J.S.Moore & Sons, Lufkin, Texas,	\$73,911.75

And each of said bids were accompanied with a certified check for \$3,000.00.

After opening and examining the bids, it was found that J.S.Moore & Sons of Lufkin, Texas, had submitted the lowest and best secure bid for said work; and on motion of E.W.Leach, seconded by A.M.Walker that said contract be awarded to the said J.S.Moore & Sons of Lufkin, Texas, whereupon the Mayor submitted the question to a vote of the Commissioners, and all voted yea and not any voted no, the Mayor declared the contract or bid be awarded to the said J.S.Moore & Sons.

It is the further order of this City Commission that the said J.S. Moore and Sons make and execute the bond as required in the plans and specifications and deliver same to the City Manager, after which the work of construction may proceed.

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There being no further business to come before the City Commission, by move and second duly made and carried same adjourned.
