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MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD MARCH 3rd,
1925.

Be it remembered that on this the 3rd day of March, A. D. 1925 there came on and was held a regular meeting of the Honorable City Commission of the City of Lufkin, in the City Hall of said City, there being present and presiding the following officers: Sam H. Kerr, Mayor, C. F. Becker, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A. M. Walker, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, W. A. Behannon, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, K. Hoskins, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, C. N. Humason, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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Minutes of former meetings read, and by move and second duly made and carried were approved as read.

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Joe L. Menefee and E. W. Rutland appeared before the City Commission and protested further against the city building its sewer disposal plant on the city property south of the city. The Mayor appointed the members of the City Commission as a committee of the whole to make further investigation for the purpose of ^{trying to find} ~~locating~~ other locations on which to build a sewer disposal plant.

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Mayor Sam H. Kerr and City Manager C. N. Humason, those who had heretofore been authorized to make purchase of land for a well site, and for right-of-way for present pipe line to the city reservoir, reported that they had contracted with the A.M. Denman heirs for the purchase of two (2) acres of land on which to locate city water well and had leased from J. M. Singleton right-of-way for the present water main leading to the City reservoir. The price to be paid for the 2 acres for well site being \$100.00 per acre, and the price to be paid for the leased right-of-way being \$1.00. They also reported that they had contracted to purchase from the said J.M. Singleton 2-17/100 acres of land for right-of-way for the city water main leading to the city reservoir, from the A. & N.R. Ry south to his property line at a price of \$163.20.

The report having been heard by the City Commission, A. M. Walker made a motion which was seconded by K. Hoskins that the action of the

Mayor and City Manager as above outlined be in all things confirmed and the Mayor is hereby authorized to sign City Warrant payable to said parties in the respective amounts in payment for said land.

The Mayor put the question and requested all members of the City Commission who favored said motion to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". The following members voted "Aye"- Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A.M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and K. Hoskins. The following members voted "No" None. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

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It appearing that it is necessary to order the regular general Election for the City of Lufkin for the purpose of electing a Mayor, a Commissioner from Ward No. 1 and a Commissioner from Ward No. 3 to serve for the ensuing two years, by move made by A. M. Walker and seconded by F. C. Becker that said election be ordered, the motion carried unanimously. The ordinance ordering the election appears elsewhere in these minutes.

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All accounts and bills due by the city to various, parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment, and it appearing that such of said bills as had been properly audited by the City manager and approved by him should be paid, by move and second duly made and carried, the following bills were allowed:-
