MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUPKIN, TEXAS, HELD APRIL 14th, 1985.

Be it remembered that on this the 14th day of April, A. D. 1925, there came on and was held a callimeting of the Honorable ity Commission of the City of Lufkin, in the City Hall of said City, there being present and presiding the following officers: Sam H. Kerr, Mayor, C. F. Becker, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A. M. Walker, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, W. A. Behannon, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, K. Hoskins, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, C. N. Humason, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to pass an ordinance declaring the result of the General City Election held April 7th, 1925 for the purpose of electing a Mayor, a commissioner from Ward No. 1 and a Commissioner from Ward No. 3

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND DE-CLARING THE RESULT OF AN ELECTION HELD WITHIN AND FOR THE CITY OF LUPKIN ON THE FIRST TUESDAY IN APRIL, A.D. 1925, SAME BEING THE SEVENTH DAY OF APRIL, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR FROM THE CITY AT LARGE AND A CITY COMMISSIONER FROM WARD NO. 1 AND A CITY COMMISSIONER FROM WARD NO. 3," was presented for passage and approval and after same was read to the City Commission A. M. Walker made a motion which was seconded by K. Hoskins, that said ordinance be passed. The question have been put by the Mayor, requesting all who favord the said motion and the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye" and those opposed to vote "No". The following members voted "Aye" - Sam H. Kerr, C. F. Becker, A. M. Walker, W. A. Behannon and K. Hoskins. The following members voted "No" - None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance finally passed.

After the passage of the ordinance above referred to each of the newley elected officers were duly inducted into office by having administered to them the official oath of office.

Retiring Mayor, Sam H. Kerr and City Commissioner C. F. Becker, each expressed their thanks for the co-operation given them by the old City Commission and offered their assistance to the board should it be required.

Talks were made by the newley elected officers, expressing their wish to do all the good they could in the administration of the duties

of their respective offices, and the desire on their part to do the right thing and that which would be to the best interest of all the citizens of the city. They ask the full co-operation of the entire city Commission in their efforts to do the best things for the city.

The City Manager made a talk outlining a few of the things that would come af for consideration by the City Commission during the ensueing two years. Nothing, however, was presented for action.

Talks were made by other officials of the city each promising their full co-operation to the new commission in all things coming up for disposition during their term of office.
