Be it remembered that on this the 21st day of June, A.D. 1927, there was begun and helden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the City Hall in said City; present and presiding the following officers of the City: J. W. Hawkins, Mayor, Joe C. Denman, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A. M. Walker, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, M. C. Spivey, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, E. W. Leach, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V. R. Smitham, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Purpose of the meeting was to discuss with Mr. J.F.Cushing, representative of Moody-Seagraves Company the question of a Gas Franchise and such other business as may properly come before the meeting.

Different forms of gas franchises were read and discussed, but nothing done in the way of granting franchise to Moody-Seagraves Co, other than to defer action on their proposition until the regular meeting in July, 1927.

A petition signed by a number of mitizens of the City asking that D.H.Carlton be put on the police force of the City was presented but no action, other than that each member of the City Commission expressed themselves as favoring leaving the appointment of such employees in the hads of the City Manager, as provided by the City Charter of said City.

There came up for discussion the question of raising the salary of the City Manager. E. W. Leach moved that the City Manager's salary be raised \$50.00 per month; seconded by A.M.Walker, and carried by a unanimous vote of the City Commission.

The delinquent tax roll of the City showing taxes assessed for the year 1926 and which are not paid was presented for approval, and on motion made by Joe C.Denman and seconded by M.C.Spivey said delinquent tax roll was approved.
