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MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD AUG. 14th, 1928.

Be it remembered that on this the 14th day of August, A.D. 1928,
there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the
city of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof in said City;
Present and presiding the following officers of the City, to-wit:-
J.W. Hawkins, Mayor, Joe C. Denman, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, C. A.
Burke, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, M. C. Spivey, Commissioner of Ward
No. 3, W. A. Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V. R. Smitham, City
Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary,
when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was pass on
petitions for additional street paving, and do and perform such other
business as may properly come before the meeting.

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A resolution granting petition for paving certain streets and
Alleys in the City of Lufkin, Texas, were presented for approval (Names
of street and alleys fully set out in said resolution) On motion of
C. A. Burke and seconded by Joe C. Denman, said resolution was adopted
with the following vote, to-wit: AYES.- J.W. Hawkins, Joe C. Denman,
C.A. Burke, M.C. Spivey, and W.A. Abney, (NOES- None. Whereupon the
Mayor declared the motion carried and the said resolution fully adopt-
ed. (For a record of said resolution see other pages in these minutes)

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The question of making a contract for the paving of the streets
designated in the above ordinance was fully discussed, and after con-
sideration of the question and Mr. Scott Shambaugh being present stated
that he would make contract to do all other street paving designated
by the ordinance above mentioned on the same basis and at the same
price, terms, conditions etc as the contract first made for street
paving now in progress. A motion was made by Joe C. Denman and second-
ed by C. A. Burke that the contract for paving of the Street and Alleys
designated by the above ordinance be awarded to Scott Shambaugh of
Houston, Texas. The terms, conditions etc to be the same as in the
first contract awarded to him for street paving. Said motion carried
by the following vote, to-wit: AYES- J.W. Hawkins, Joe C. Denman,

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C. A. Burke, M. C. Spivey and W.A.Abney. NOES- None.

~~The Lufkin Natural Gas Company~~ appeared by Attorney and asked that they be released from filing the bond heretofore ~~gea~~quired of them for an extension of time to furnish gas, and also to allow them the time heretofore agreed upon as an extension of time. After considering the question it was moved by C.A.Burke and seconded by W.A.Abney that the said Lufkin Natural Gas Company be released from filing the bond afore-said and that they be allowed the 45 day extension of time without bond. The Mayor put the question, and the following vote is here entered of record in these minutes, to-wit: "AYES"- C.A.Burke and W.A.Abney, "NOES"- J.W.Hawkins, Joe C. Denman and M.C.Spivey. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion defeated, and that the ~~said Lufkin Natural Gas Company~~ *L. F. Troxel* be required to file the bond as first demanded of them. It was also agreed that inasmuch as said bond had not been filed, that unless said bond was filed on or before August 20th. 1928, said franchise would be cancelled and declared void.

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City Manager V R Smitham recommended that the salary of J. B. Woiton Assistant City Manager or Paving Engineer be raised from \$185.00 per month to \$200.00 per month. After considering said recommendation it was moved by C.A.Burke and seconded by Joe C. Denman that the salary of the said J.B. Woiton be raised as recommended by the said City Manager. The motion carried unanimously.

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✓ An ordinance changing the name of Bond Avenue to Abney Avenue was presented and passed by the following vote- Ayes"-J.W.Hawkins, Joe C. Denman, C.A.Burke, M.C.Spivey and W.A.Abney. Noes- None. (For a record of said ordinance see another page of these minutes)

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An ordinance changing the name of Dozier Avenue from Angelina Avenue to its intersection with Frank Avenue to Frank Avenue was presented for passage and approval and was passed by the following vote- "AYES" J.W. Hawkins, Joe C. Denman, C.A.Burke, M.C.Spivey, and W.A.Abney, (NOES- None (For a record of said ordinance see another page of these minutes.)

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried same adjourned.
