THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUF-  
KIN, TEXAS, HELD APRIL 2nd, 1929.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of April, A. D. 1929,  
there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of  
the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with  
the following officers of the city present and presiding:- J. W. Hawkins,  
Mayor, Joe C. Denman, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, C. A. Burke, Commis-  
sioner of Ward No. 2, M. C. Spivey, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, W. A. Abney,  
Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V. R. Smitham City Manager, W. O. Seale,  
City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following pro-  
ceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of former meetings of the City Commission read and on mo-  
tion duly made and carried were approved as read.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE VARIOUS KINDS OF  
GARBAGE, REGULATING THE KIND AND SIZE OF RECEPACLES IN WHICH TO PLACE  
SAME, THE MANNER OF ITS PREPATATION AND WHERE IT MUST BE PLACED TO BE  
COLLECTED BY THE CITY GARBAGE DEPARTMENT: PROVIDING REGULATIONS FOR COL-  
LECTING SAME AND PROHIBITING THE PLACING OF GARBAGE OR ANY ARTICLE OR  
MATERIAL IN THE STREETS AND ALLEYS OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN; PROHIBITING  
THE MEDDLING, SCATTERING CONTENTS, PILFERING OR JUNKING, WITH GARBAGE  
CANS, TRASH OR RUBBISH RECEPACLES, PROHIBITING JUNKING AND CARRYING  
OF GARBAGE OFF THE PREMISES OF THE DUMP GROUND ANY ARTICLE OR JUNK:  
PROHINITING THE COLLECTION OF GARBAGE, TRASH OR RUBBISH WITHIN THE CITY  
LIMITS: AND PRESCRINING A PENALTY." was presented for passage and app-  
proval on second and final reading. On motion made by Joe C. Denman,  
and seconded by M. C. Spivey said ordinance was placed on second read -  
ing and passed on second and final reading by the following vote of  
the City Commission: "Ayes"- J.W.Hawkins, Joe C. Denman, C. A. Burke,  
M. C. Spivey and W. A. Abney. "Noes"- None- Whereupon the Mayor de-  
clared the said ordinance finally passed on second reading, according  
to its terms.

It appearing that Kiln Avenue from its intersection with west  
line of South Raguet Street to its intersection with east line of  
south Bynum street; Ellis Avenue from its intersection with east line  
of F. B. Thompson's property and west of Walter Harris' property on  
Ellis Avenue; and Bynum Street from its interesection with south line  
of Frank Avenue to its intersection with north line of Mantooth Ave-  
nue, which had heretofore been contracted to be paved had been paved,  
and upon recommendation by the City Manager that same be accepted, on  
motion made by M. C. Spivey and seconded by W. A. Abney, same were  
received as completed according to contract with Scott Shambaugh.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION ONE OF AN  
ORDINACNE OF DATE JUNE 5, A.D. 1928, WHICH SAID SECTION OF SAID ORDI-  
NANCE PROVIDED THAT IT SHOULD BE UNLAWFUL TO LEAVE STANDING OR PARK  
ANY AUTOMOBILE FOR ONE HOUR OR LONGER WITH A SPECIFIED TERRITORY FROM  
BETWEEN 9:00 a.m. AND 6: P.M.", was presented for passange and approval.

On motion made by C. A. Burke and seconded by W. A. Abney that said  
ordinance be finally passed, same did pass by the following vote, to-wit:  
"Ayes" Joe C. Denman, J. W. Hawkins, C. A. Burke and W.A. Abney. "Noes"  
M.C.Spivey. Whereupon the Mayor declared the said ordinance finally  
passed by a majority vote of the City Commission.

City Manager V. R. Smitham reported that acting upon authority granted to him at a former meeting of the City Commission, he had made contract for a Road Grader; that he had purchased a J.D. Adams, leaning wheel grader at the following price and on the following terms: total price of \$1,070.00. Payable as follows: \$256.66 due on March 15th, 1930, \$356.67 due on March 15th, 1931 and \$356.67 due March 15th, 1932, all deferred payments drawing interest at the rate of 6% from date until paid. On motion duly made and carried the action of the City manager was in all things confirmed and approved.

"RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN GRANTING PETITIONS FOR STREET AND AVENUE IMPROVEMENTS, AND PROVIDING AN EMERGENCY" was presented for passage and approval and on motion made by W.A. Abney, and seconded by C.A. Burke said resolution passed by a unanimous vote of the City Commission.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DESIGNATION STREETS AND AVENUES AND PORTIONS THEREOF TO BE IMPROVED WITH AND FOR THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, AND PROVIDING FOR PAVING OF STREETS AND AVENUES AND SECTIONS THEREOF, AND MAKING REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO THE PROPER ENFORCEMENT AND CONDUCT FOR SUCH IMPROVEMENTS, AND PROVIDING AN EMERGENCY", was presented for passage and approval, and on motion made by Joe C. Denman, seconded by M.C. Spivey, said ordinance passed by a unanimous vote of the City Commission.

An ORDINANCE APPROVING CONTRACT WITH SCOTT SHAMBAUGH OF HOUSTON, TEXAS, FOR THE IMPROVING OF CERTAIN STREETS AND AVENUES IN THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, AS HEREINAFTER SPECIFIED, ADOPTING AND SPECIFYING THE CHARACTER OF PAVEMENT TO BE LAID THEREON; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF SAID CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, APPROVING BONDS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO PAY THE CITY'S PORTION OF THE COST THEREOF, AND DIRECTING THE CITY ENGINEER TO PREPARE AND FILE WRITTEN STATEMENT OF PERSONS, FIRMS AND OTHERS OWNING PROPERTY ABUTTING UPON THESE STREETS AND AVENUES WITH A DESCRIPTION OF SUCH PROPERTY, THE NUMBER OF FRONT FEET OWNED BY EACH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY", was presented for passage and approval, and upon motion made by C. A. Burke and seconded by W.A. Abney, said motion passed by a unanimous vote of the City Commission.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE CITY ENGINEER'S WRITTEN STATEMENT OF PERSONS, FIRMS, CORPORATIONS AND ESTATES OWNING PROPERTY ABUTTING ON CERTAIN STREETS, AVENUES, ALLEYS OR HIGHWAYS IN THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS; AS HEREINAFTER SPECIFIED; THE NUMBER OF FRONT FEET OWNED BY EACH, A DESCRIPTION OF THEIR PROPERTY, THE ESTIMATED COST PER FRONT FOOT OF ABUTTING PROPERTY AND THE ESTIMATED AMOUNT TO BE ASSESSED AGAINST SAID OWNERS, RESPECTIVELY, AND THEIR PROPERTY; DETERMINING THE NECESSITY OF LEVYING AN ASSESSMENT AGAINST THE OWNERS OF ABUTTING

PROPERTY AND THEIR PROPERTY FOR A PORTION OF THE COST OF IMPROVING SAID STREETS, AVENUES, ALLEYS OR HIGHWAYS? SETTING 10 o'clock A.M. ON THE 18th DAY OF APRIL 1929, IN THE CITY HALL IN LUFKIN, TEXAS, AS THE TIME AND PLACE FOR HEARING OF THE OWNERS OF SAID PROPERTY CONCERNING SAID ASSESSMENTS DIRECTING THE CITY SECRETARY TO GIVE NOTICE OF SAID HEARING, AND ECLARING AN EMERGENCY", was presented for passage and approval, and on motich made by M. C. Spivey, seconded by Joe C. Denman, said ordnance passed by a unanimous vote of the City Commission.

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN HELD APRIL 2, A. D. 1929.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of April A. D. 1929, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Hall thereof with the following members present, to-wit: J. W. Hawkins, Mayor; J. C. Denman, Commissioner Ward No. 1; C. A. Burke, Commissioner Ward No. 2; M. C. Spivey, Commissioner Ward No. 3; W. A. Abney, Commissioner Ward No. 4; V. R. Smitham, City Manager; T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, and W. O. Seal e, City Attorney, when among other matters the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

It appearing to the City Commission that that portions of two avenues and one street, viz:

(a) Kiln Avenue from its intersection with west line of South Raguet Street to its intersection with east line of South Bynum Street;


(b) Ellis Avenue from its intersection with east line of Kelley Street to its intersection with west line of F. B. Thompson's property and west line of Walter Harris' property on Ellis Avenue;

(c) Bynum Street from its intersection with south line of Frank Avenue to its intersection with north line of Mantooth Avenue;

have been completed according to contract for street paving with Scott Shambaugh of Houston, Texas, of date Aug. 24th A. D. 1928, and the acceptance of said avenues and street have been recommended in writing by City Engineer and City Manager, Mr. V. R. Smitham; on motion M. C. Spivey, seconded by Joe C. Denman, all voting yea, said avenues and street were accepted from Scott Shambaugh, paving contractor, and said improvement on said avenues and street are now received and accepted by the City.

The Mayor and City Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to issue improvement assessment certificates therefor in accordance with the assessments ordinance heretofore passed, a form of said assessment certificates has heretofore been approved for use in the present paving program, which is in all respects approved.
