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Be it remembered that on this the 5th day of April, A.D. 1929,  
there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of  
the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof in said City  
Present and presiding the following officers of the City, to-wit:-  
J. W. Hawkins, Present, Joe C. Denman, Commissioner of Ward No. 1,  
C. A. Burke, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, M. C. Spivey, Commissioner of  
Ward No. 3, W. A. Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, V. R. Smitham,  
City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary,  
when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was declared  
the result of the General City Election held on the 2nd day of April,  
A. D. 1929, for the purpose of electing a Mayor, a City Commissioner  
from Ward No. 1 and a City Commissioner from Ward No. 3, and to do  
and perform any such other business as may properly come before the  
meeting.

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An Ordinance intitled "AN ORDINANCE CANVASSING THE RETURNS AND  
DECLARING THE RESULT OF AN ELECTION HELD WITHIN AND FOR THE CITY OF  
LUFKIN IN THE FIRST TUESDAY IN APRIL, A.D. 1929, SAME BEING THE 2nd  
DAY THEREOF, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A CITY COMMISSIONER FROM  
WARD NO. ONE AND A CITY COMMISSIONER FROM WARD NO THREE AND A MAYOR  
FROM THE CITY AT LARGE," was presented for passage and approval and  
on motion of C. A. Burke, seconded by M. C. Spivey said ordinance was  
read and finally passed and approved, which said ordinance appears at  
another page in these minutes.

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After the adoption and passage of the said ordinance, each of  
the newly elected officers were duly inducted into office by having  
administered to them the OATH OF OFFICE prescribed by law. Joe C.  
Denman, took the chair as Mayor and presided the remaining part of  
the meeting.

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It appearing to the City Commission that that portions of two  
streets and one avenue, viz:

- (a) Kelley Street from its intersection with the north line of  
Ellis Avenue to its intersection with the south line of Frank Avenue;
- (b) Kelley Street from its intersection with north line of Frank  
Avenue to its intersection with south line of Mantooth Avenue;
- (c) Howe Avenue from its intersection with east line of Second  
Street to its intersection with west line of Fifth Street; have been  
completed accoring to contract for street paving with Scott Shambaugh

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and that the acceptance of said streets and avenues have been recommended in writing by the City Engineer or City Manager, on motion of C. A. Burke and seconded by W. A. Abney, all voting yea, said avenue and streets were accepted

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It appearing that an order had heretofore been entered on these minutes whereby it was agreed to donate a sum not to exceed \$100.00 to partly bear the expense of moving W.S. Poston's residence in order to conform to present line of new pavement, and it now appearing to the City Commission that such order should be rescinded, on motion made by C. A. Burke, seconded by C. E. Brazil, all members voting "yea" said order is hereby in all things rescinded and declared null and void.

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An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION TO PARK OR LEAVE STANDING ANY VEHICLE EXCEPT FOR LOADING OR UNLOADING FREIGHT, GOODS, WARRES OR MERCHANDISE WITHIN ANY LOADING OR UNLOADING ZONE AS MARKED ON THE STREET CURBS IN CERTAIN TERRITORY AS HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED; PROVIDING FREIGHT MAY LOADED AND UNLOADED AT ANY PLACE WHEN THE TRUCK OR OTHER VEHICLE IS PLACED IN AN "UNLOADING ZONE" OR PARKING SPACE: AFFIXING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION: AND CREATING AN EMERGENCY."

was presented for passage and approval as an emergency measure. After reading said ordinance it was moved by W. A. Abney and seconded by C. E. Brazil that said ordinance pass as an emergency measure, said motion was passed by the Mayor and the following vote is here entered of record: "AYES" Joe. C. Denman, C. A. Burke, R. C. Jordan and W. A. Abney. "NOES"—None— Whereupon the Mayor declared the ordinance passed and approved.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, same adjourned.

L. Dunn, City Secretary, and W. O. Seale, City Attorney, when among other matters the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

It appearing to the City Commission that that portions of two streets and one avenue, viz:

- (a) Kelley Street from its intersection with the north line of Ellis Avenue to its intersection with the south line of Frank Avenue;
- (b) Kelley Street from its intersection with north line of Frank Avenue to its intersection with south line of Mantooth Avenue;
- (c) Howe Avenue from its intersection with east line of Second Street to its intersection with west line of Fifth Street;

have been completed according to contract for street paving with Scott Shambaugh of Houston, Texas, of date Aug. 24th A. D. 1928, and the acceptance of said avenues and streets have been recommended in writing by City Engineer and City Manager, Mr. V. R. Smitham; on motion C. A. Burke, seconded by W. A. Abney, all voting yea, said avenue and streets were accepted from Scott Shambaugh, paving contractor, and said improvement on said avenue and streets are now received and accepted by the City.

The Mayor and City Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to issue improvement assessment certificates therefor in accordance with the assessments ordinance heretofore passed, a form of said assessment certificates has heretofore been approved for use in the present paving program, which is in all respects approved.
