MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD June 3rd, A. D. 1930.

Be it remembered that on this the 3rd day of June, A. D. 1930, there was held a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the municipal Office thereof in said city, with the following officers of the city present and presiding:- Joe C. Denman, Mayor, C. E. Brazil, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, C. A. Burke, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, R. C. Jordan, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, W. A. Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, W. D. Tiner, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of former meetings read and motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

A letter from the Lufkin Foundry and Machine Company, complaining of flood waters in their vicinity was read to the City Commission. In said letter it was suggested that the city install drain inlets or grates at different points in the curbs to provide more opening through which water could find its way from the pavement into the storm sewer in that locality. The Lufkin Foundry having offered to furnish said grates to the city if the city would install same it was unanimously carried that they be installed and the city Manager was instructed to proceed with such work.

Mrs. Jas Burns, through her attorney, complains that flood waters are doing damage to her property. The City manager reported that he had investigated the matter and stated that water was overflowing the curb adjacent to her property, and said that by building a secondary curb at back of present curb high enough would provide one remedy for keeping back the waters, or that the sidewalk might be raised which would also keep back said flood waters. The cost of the two jobs being considered it was decided by the City Commission that the sidewalk be raised as suggested by the City Manager.

The City Manager reported that quite a considerable lot of old junk had accumulated at the waterworks plant, and asked permission to sell same. The request was unanimously granted.

All accounts and bills due by the city to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment and it appearing that subh of said bills as had been properly audited and approved by the City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried same were allowed.
