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Be it remembered that on this the 7th day of April, A.D. 1931, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Munccipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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Minutes of former meetings read and approved.

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A discussion of the park situation in the City was discussed, it having been called to the attention of the City Commission that people were hauling dirt from the park grounds at the Kurth Ward School and that much trash, cans etc were being dumped thereon. The City manager stated that it was his intention to give the parks grounds some attention during the year, one thing to be done was to put some kind of a temporary fence around same to protect it. Nothing definite was decided upon.

The matter of passing "vegatable ordinance" was discussed, but the matter was passed wothout final action. City Attorney was instructed to draw one for consideration at some future meeting the City Commission.

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The City Manager brought up the question of requiring the Police to wear uniforms. It was finally decided that any blue serge suit with regulation police cap would be enough to wear.

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It was suggested by the City Manager that something should be done about amending the gas piping ordinance as pertains to venting gas water heaters. City Manager was instructed to prepare some text of ordinance and submit same for consideration with his recommendation.

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The City Manager reported that the old caterpriller tractor which had been in service for some time had just about been worn out, and suggested that the City Commission consider the purchase of a one-man machine for street maintenance purposes. The City Manager was instructed to get prices and become acquainted with the different makes of machines as would be best adapted to the city's needs and then to make his report and recommendations.

Accounts and bills due by the city to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment, and it appearing that such of said bills as had been properly approved for payment by the City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried same were allowed.
