MINUTES OF A GALL MEETING OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD APRIL 22nd, 1932.

Be it remembered that on this the 22nd day of April, A. D. 1932, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

The purpose of the meeting as announced by the Mayor was to consider the passage of an amendment to the present "Milk Ordinance", whereby the sale of Grade "D" milk would be prohibited in the City of Lufkin, Texas, and to do and perform any other business that might properly come before the meeting.

A. V. Gummings appeared before the ^City Commission and presented a claim (oral) in the amount of \$15.00 claimed by him to be due by the City for time for himself and his truck hauling rock. After hearing his statement and statement by Acting City Manager T.L.Dunn, the said T.L. Dunn stating that he had allowed him the sum of \$7.50 for the work performed, considering him the said A.V. Cummings as being one of the ^Community Chest workers under supervision of Mrs. Sharpe secretary of the Community Chest, which amount of \$7.50 was the amount allowed ether workers under the same conditions, it was agreed that the amount of \$7.50 was proper under the circumstances, and the ^City Manager was instructed to settle the claim with Mr. Cummings according to said figure of \$7.50.

The question of passing an ordinance amending the present "Milk Ordinacne" was entered into, there being several men advocating the passage of such ordinance and there being a great number of men opposing the adoption of such an ordinance. The question was discussed pro and con by all parties present, but nothing definitely agreed upon. The

matter was passed for further consideration and final action.
