ADAMS AND WIFE, EMMIE ADAMS, WHICH IS A PART OF LOT TWO IN BLOCK THREE OF THE DEMMAN ADDITION TO THE TOWN OF LUFKIN BY THE CITY OF LUFKIN TO BE NECESSARY FOR STREET PURPO-SES-AND AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN TO PURCHASE FOR AND IN BEHALF OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN SUCH PROPERTY BY A-GREEMENT FROM THE OWNERS THEREOF AND PAY FROM FUNDS BELONGING TO SAID CITY AND AVAILABLE THEREFOR THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS FOR SUCH PROPERTY AND MOVE IMPROVEMENTS THEREFROM AT THE EXPENSEN OF SAID CITY, was introduced for passage and approval on first reading.
