Be it remembered that on this the 5th day of October, A.D. 1937, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission and for the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of meetings held during the month of September, A.D. 1937 were read and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

R. B. Squyres, representing the United Gas Corporation was present and presented a proposition for consideration by the City Commission wherein at is proposed to establish a new and lower rate for gas consumption, both for residential and commercial use. Before the acceptance of the proposition and the passage of an ordinance putting into effect the new proposed rate, it becomes necessary to pass an ordinance repealing all prior ordinances passed fixing rates. Therefore the following ordinance was presented for passage and approval on first reading:

"AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTION 20 OF AN ORDINANCE PASSED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, ON THE 8TH DAY OF JUNE, 1929, GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO THE DIXIE GAS & FUEL COMPANY AND FURTHER REPEALING ALL OF THOSE CERTAIN ORDINANCES PASSED AND ADOPTED THE CITY COUNCIL ON THE 4TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1932, AND ON THE 20TH DAY OF MARCH, 1934, ESTABLISHING RATES TO BE CHARGED FOR NATURAL GAS DELIVERED AND GAS SERVICE FURNISHED TO CERTAIN CLASSES OF CONSUMERS WITHIN THE CITY OF LUFKIN"

The above entitled ordinance having been presented as aforesaid, it was moved by Commissioner J. B. Perry and seconded by Commissioner W.D.Winston, Jr. that said ordinance be placed on first reading and that be passed and approved on first reading. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion: "Ayes" W.M.Glenn, W.D.Winston, Jr., Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES"- None- Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the said ordinance passed and approved first reading.

Further consideration of the passage of an ordinance regulating Barber Shops was given, City Attorney Fenley, in accordance with instructions previously given, reported that his investigation disclosed that it was

very doubtful if such an ordinance could be enforced. The matter was discussed thoroughly, but was passed without any action.

The matter of a settlement of City Taxes (delinquent) with R. L. Perry was discussed, after which on motion by W.D.Winston, Jr., seconded by J. E. Jay, it was carried unanimously that settlement be made on a basis of a value of \$12,000.00 for real estate and improvements, plus all accrued penalties, interest, costs and court costs. A statement of the amount due was ordered made up and given to fityAttorney Curtis W. Fehley with authority to settle in accordance with said motion.

All bills and accounts due by the City to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment, and it appearing that such of said bills as had been property audited and approved for payment by the City Manager, should be paid, on motion duly made and carried were allowed.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried it adjourned.
