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MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD FEBRUARY 23rd, 1937.

Be it remembered that on this the 23rd day of February, A.D. 1937,
there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the
City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the fol-
lowing officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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S. W. Henderson, Jr was present and presented a matter relative to
delinquent City Taxes on certain property now owned by Mrs. S.W.Henderson,
Sr. which property was formerly known and assessed on the Tax Rolls as the
C.C.W.Sneed property at 511 Moore Avenue. He represented that, in his opin-
ion, an adjustment as to value fixed for various years should be made for
the reason that the assessment had been too high, and suggested that the
values be fixed as follows: For 1923, \$1,500.00; 1925, \$1,500.00; 1926,
\$1,500.00; 1927, \$1,500.00; 1929, \$1,200.00, 1930, \$1,200.00; 1931, \$1,200.00
1932; \$1,200.00; 1933, \$1,200.00; 1934, \$1,200.00 and 1935, \$1,200.00. He
stated that he was ready and willing to pay the taxes for the years due on
a basis of the values suggested. After considering the matter it was moved
by Lewis Hicks and seconded by J. B. Perry, that the values for tax pur-
poses for the years above mentioned, be fixed at the values suggested for
the reason that it is the opinion the assessed value as shown on the rolls
was too high. The Mayor put the question and the motion carried unanimously.

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A representative of the State Board of Control was present and pre-
sented a plan for Child Welfare Work in Angelina County and suggested that
the City pay one-half of the cost of same, estimated at \$100.00 per month.
The City Commission considered carefully the plan and expressed approval of
same insofar as the good that could be accomplished, but because of the lack
of funds declined to contribute any money for the support of the work.

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A resolution entitled "RESOLUTION AND ORDER BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF
THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, AGREEING TO PAY FOR,
AND HAVE PAVED, CERTAIN PAVING ON RAGUET STREET
FROM THE END OF THE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT NOW
UNDER CONSTRUCTION, WHICH ENDS NEAR THE INTERSEC-
TION OF RAGUET STREET AND ABNEY AVENUE, TO THE
INTERSECTION OF RAGUET STREET AND ELLIS AVENUE"

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was introduced for passage and approval. Commissioner W. O. Greene, introduced the resolution and order and moved its adoption. Commissioner J. E. Jay seconded the motion. The Mayor put the question and it carried unanimously. (See another page of these minutes for a record of the resolution and order)

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An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING GUS THEOBALD, A MASTER PLUMBER, AND J.E. LAURENCE, A JOURNEYMAN PLUMBER, AS MEMBERS OF THE EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD OF PLUMBERS"

was introduced for passage and approval. The ordinance was read to the City Commission after which it was moved by Lewis Hicks and seconded by J. E. Jay that said ordinance be passed and approved. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion: "Ayes"- Kenneth Hoskins, W. O. Greene, Lewis Hicks, J.B. Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES"- None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and approved. (See another page of these minutes for a record of the ordinance)

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A Proclamation by the Mayor proclaiming the week of February 28th to March 6th, 1937 as "TEXAS WEEK" was presented for approval. It was moved by W. O. Greene and seconded by J. B. Perry that such proclamation be made and executed by the Mayor. The motion carried unanimously. 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An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE TIME LIMIT FOR REQUESTS FOR NAMES TO GO ON THE OFFICIAL BALLOT FOR THE REGULAR ELECTION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, KIND AND MANNER OF REQUEST, AND ORDER OF NAMES TO APPEAR ON BALLOT"

was introduced for passage and approval on first reading. The ordinance was placed on first reading and it was moved by Lewis Hicks and seconded by J. E. Jay that said ordinance be passed and approved on first reading. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion: "AYES"- Kenneth Hoskins, W. O. Greene, Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES"- None- Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and approved on first reading.

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An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING SOLICITORS, PEDDLERS, ITENERANT MERCHANTS AND TRANSCIENT VENDORS OF MERCHANDISE, FROM PLYING THEIR TRADE IN AND UPON PRIVATE RESIDENCES IN THE CITY OF LUFKIN, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREFOR"

was introduced for passage and approval on first reading. The ordinance was placed on first reading, after which it was moved by J. B. Perry and seconded by Lewis Hicks that said ordinance be passed and approved on first

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reading. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion. "AYES"- Kenneth Hoskins, W. O. Greene, Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay - "NOES"- None- Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the said ordinance passed and approved on first reading.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried it adjourned.
