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MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN,
TEXAS, HELD SEPT. 17th. 1929.

Be it remembered that on this the 17th day of September, A.D. 1929,
there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the
City of Lufkin, Texas, at the City Hall in said City; present and pre-
siding the following officers of the City, to-wit:- C. A. Burke, Com-
missioner of Ward No. 2 and Mayor Protem, R. S. Jordan, Commissioner
of Ward No. 3 and W. A. Abney, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, W. D. Tiner
City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and C.H. Rice, Acting City
Secretary. Mayor, Joe C. Denman and C. E. Brazil Commissioners of
Ward No. 1 was absent. The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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E. J. Mantooth, G. A. Kelley and J. L. Phillips, representatives
from the Lufkin Ice Company appeared regarding the paving of Mill St.
as heretofore advertised. The City having, by its city Commission,
decided that the cost of paving the property of Jim Grumpler and
Mrs. J. T. Hicks would be more than the enhanced value as a result
of the paving and that a legal assessment could not be made against
their said property, and they also protesting against the paving of
said street in front of their property. It therefore appearing that
there would be a "leave out" on said street on the West side adja-
cent to the said Grumpler and Hicks property and that the paving as
proposed would be too narrow to permit of a "leave out". The above
named men as representatives of the Lufkin Ice Company stated that
they wanted the street paved regardless of the condition of things,
and guaranteed the payment of the cost of paving all on the West
side of said Mill Street. On motion duly made and carried it was
ordered to pave said street with the understanding that the cost
of paving the property owners part on the West side of said Street
would be paid by the Lufkin Ice Company, or at least guaranteed by
them.

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and

L. G. Kennerly, W B Moore, J A Holloway appeared with refer-
ence to paving on Lake Street in front of the Martin Property on
said street. The City Commission was without authority to do any-
thing regarding said property.

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It appearing that N. First Street, Alton Street and Fred Street
had been paved accordin to contract and that recommendation for ac-
ceptance of same had been made by the City Engineer, it was moved by

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W. A. Abney and seconded by R. C. Jordan that said streets be accepted.
The Motion carried unanimously.

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An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER TO L.H.DENMAN A QUITCLAIM DEED TO TEN ACRES OF LAND, MORE OR LESS, A PORTION OF THE A. VARELLA LEAGUE DESCRIBED IN A DEED FROM THOMAS B BLEDSOE TO A H GARBUTT DATED NOVEMBER 14, 1914 AND RECORDED IN BOOK 36 PAGE 501 OF THE DEED RECORDS OF ANGELINA COUNTY, TEXAS" was presented for passage and approval on second reading. W. A. Abney made the motion and R.C. Jordan seconded same that said ordinance be placed on second reading and that same pass second reading. The motion carried unanimously.

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An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 19 and 14 of and Ordinance regulating the installation of gas piping within the City of Lufkin of date June 5th, A D 1928, and providing penalties, was presented for passage and approval on second reading. R.C.Jordan made the motion and W.A. Abney seconded same that said ordinance be placed on second reading and that same pass second reading. The motion carried unanimously.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried same adjourned.

when the following proceedings were had to-wit:

One of the purposes of this meeting as stated by the Mayor was to discuss the advisability of passing an ordinance authorizing and directing the Mayor and Secretary to make, execute and deliver to the Lufkin Foundry & Machine Company a quit-claim deed to that abandoned portion of Douglas Street from its intersection with south line of Kiln Avenue to its intersection with west line of H. E. & W. T. Ry. Company's right of way; and Noble Avenue from its intersection with east line of Raguet Street to its intersection with west line of H. E. & W. T. Ry. Company's right of way, for and in consideration of the sum of \$307.20 cash.

On Motion of Commissioner Burke, seconded by Commissioner W. A. Abney, all present voting "Yea", the Mayor, Hon. Joe C. Denman, and the City Secretary, T. L. Dunn, be and they are hereby authorized and directed in the name of the City of Lufkin, Texas, to make, execute and deliver to the Lufkin Foundry & Machine Company of Lufkin, Texas, all the right, title and interest of the City of Lufkin in and to said abandoned portion of Douglas Street and Noble Avenue in the City of Lufkin, Angelina County, Texas for and in consideration of the sum of \$307.20 in cash, said amount representing the proportionate part the City of Lufkin paid for paving said streets at their intersections.
