MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD MAY 3rd, 1921.

Be it remembered that on this the 3rd day of May A. D. there was begun and holden a regular term of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municpal office there in said City, with following memberes of said City Commission present: - G. A. Kelley, Mayor, S. R. Parker, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, E. E. Woods, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, B.L. Zeagler, Commissioner of Ward No. 3 and W. B. Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4. City Manager J. O. Booker and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, was also present, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of regular meeting held April 5th, 1921, and call meeing held April 11th, 1921, read, and by move and second duly made and carried were approved as read.

It appearing to the City Commission that the Lufkin Foundary and Machine Company is due the City of Lufkin a certain amount as refund for Cast Iron Water pipe heretofore bought from them, which was later used by said Foundary, and that the City of Lufkin is due the Lufkin Foundary and Machine Company a certain amount for supplies etc. purchased from them from time, by move and second duly made and carried, City Manager J. O. Booker was instructed to proceed at once to get settlement with said Foundary of said accounts.

The account of Thos. Y. Pickett, auditor for services auditing the City books for the year beginning April 1st, 1920 and ending March 31st, 1921 was considered by the Commission, and it appearing that the report of said audit was in-complete, by move and second duly made and carried, payment of said bill was held up until said audit is completed and made correct.

It appearing to the City Commission that it is necessary to appoint and select Depository for City Funds for the ensuing two years, by move and second duly made and carried, the City Secretary was instructed to advertise in the Lufkin Daily News for bids as provided in the City Charter the highest bidder on rate of interest to paid on daily balances of city funds to be selected as such depository as aforesaid.

The Secretary of the Lufkin Chamber of Commerce with Postmaster O.J. Lang appeared before the City Commission and submitted data relative to the establishment of free mail delivery in the the City limits, which was duly considered by said Commission and by move and second duly made and carried, City Manager, J. O. Booker was instructed to co-operate with said Postmaster, O. J. Lang, in preparing necessary maps, profiles etc. with the view of establishing free mail delivery in said City.

A claim of C. F. Feigle, volunteer firemand of the City of Lufkin for damages sustained by him in a wreck of the two fire engines on or about February 27th 1921, was presented for consideration by the City Commission, and by move and second duly made and carried, City Attorney, W. O. Seale was instructed to take up with said Feigle the matter of settling said claim.

The question of opening up and grading Mantooth Avenue from Raguett Street West to Kelley Street was discussed by the City Commission, and by move and second duly made and carried, said street is ordered opened up on condition that Judge Ξ . J. Mantooth dedicate said street to the City of Lufkin, Texas, and clear trees etc from same.

The question of collecting an amount from L. Mitchell, former City Manager for cement shipped by him to Corrigan, Texas, and used in the construction of a foundation for a rock crusher as said place, was discussed by the City commission, and by move and second duly made and carried, City Manager, J. O. Booker was instructed to proceed to collect such amount as may be found due the City by the said L. Mitchell.

It appearing to the City Commission that there is being operated a wash rack on Fireman's park, and that cars belonging to private individuals are being repaird on said park, it is the opinion of said City Commission that was rack and the practice of wepairing cars on said Fireman's park should be stopped. Therefore, by move and second duly made and carried, it is ordered that said wash rack be cut out, and that the repairing of cars as aforesaid be stopped.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.

The above and foregoing minutes of the May, 1921, regular meeting of the City Commission read and approved on this the 7th day of June, 1921.
