MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF  
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF  
LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD Feb. 3rd, 1925.

Be it remembered that on this the 3rd day of February, A.D. 1925  
there came on and was held a regular meeting of the Honorable City Com-  
mission of the City of Lufkin, in the City Hall of said City, there  
being present and presiding the following officers: Sam H. Kerr, Mayor,  
C. F. Becker, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, A. M. Walker, Commissioner of  
Ward No. 2, W. A. Behannon, Commissioner of Ward No. 3, K. Hoskins, Com-  
missioner of Ward No. 4, C. N. Humason, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City  
Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings  
were had, to-wit:--

Minutes of former meetings read, and by move and second duly made  
and carried were approved as read.

-----oOo-----

The Committee appointed to make purchase of acreage for additional  
Reservoir purposes stated they were not ready to make a report, and  
asked for and was granted more time in which to report.

A petition signed by Robt. Dennum et als, praying for the repeal of  
what is known as the "Jitney Ordinance", was presented for consideration  
by the City Commission, and after discussion of the question involved  
action was deferred until a future date.

A proposition by Lane Texas Company to produce additional amount  
of water over and above the amount provided in the original contract  
for the production of 200,000 gallons per day was read to the City Com-  
mission, which said proposition provided for the payment of \$15.00 per  
gallon per minute for all amount of water produced over and above the  
said 200,000 gallon per day contract. After discussing the proposition,  
action thereon was deferred until further conference could be had with  
officials of the Lane Texas Company.

A resolution of thanks was voted on behalf of the State Board of  
Health of Texas and the Texas Waterworks Association, for courtesies  
extended to Mr. Tom Russell, City Engineer and Waterworks man at the  
City Reservoir, while he was attending the Waterworks School at Austin,  
Texas, and for the benefits derived therefrom.

The question of requiring the City Depository of City Funds to make and execute a surety bond in the sum of \$65,000.00 to cover funds now on deposit and amounts showing on deposit daily in future was thoroughly discussed after which on motion of C.F. Becker seconded by A.M. Walker, it was unanimously voted to require the Guaranty State Bank and Trust Company of Lufkin, Texas, to execute the kind of bond above described and in the amount stated, condition as required by law, and that the City pay the premium thereon.
