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MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,
HELD FEBRUARY 5th, 1935.

Be it remembered that on this the 5th day of February, A D 1935, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

D. A. Campbell, Commissioner of Ward No. 3 was absent on account of being absent from the City.

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:

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Minutes of meetings held during the month of January, 1935, were read and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

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W. L. Parrish, manager of the local Air Port was present and at request made a talk along the line of possibilities of an Air Port development for the City. His talk was listened to with interest. No definite plan for Air Port Development was made however.

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Mr. O. Bessler of Nacogdoches, Texas, made application for a permit to construct a Bill Board on the West Side of North First Street in a "dead end" street leading westwardly from North First Street to the right-of-way of the T & N O Ry Co., and is opposite The Texas Company Service Station situated in the Fairchild Boynton Addition to the City of Lufkin. One motion duly made and carried construction of a Bill Board as aforesaid is permitted.

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On recommendation of the City Manager, it was moved and carried that payment of 1934 City Advalorem Taxes be extended to March 15th, 1935, without penalty or interest.

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The question of allowing fishing in the City Reservoir during closed season for fishing was discussed, and on motion by W.O. Greene, seconded by Louis Hicks, it was carried unanimously that no fishing be allowed at the City Reservoir except during "open season" for fishing, and then only on payment of the required fee.

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The matter of passing an ordinance looking to the control of peddling within the City Limits of the City of Lufkin was thoroughly discussed, after which City Attorney Curtis W. Fenley was instructed to prepare an ordinance along that line and report to the next meeting of the City Commission.

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On motion duly made and carried, refund to Curtis Fenley, City Attorney, for amount paid by him account of making entrance from outside to Stairway leading to his office at the City Hall, was authorized.

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Bills and account due by the City to various parties, firms and corporations for supplies, services and etc. were presented for payment, and it appearing that such of said bills as had been approved by The City Manager should be paid, on motion duly made and carried, were allowed.

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There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.
