constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. Mr. A. C. McQueen was present in the interest of leasing the Municipal Air Port and after general discussion of the matter motion was made by R.E.Melvin, second by B. F. Milligan and carried by all members voting yea authorizing lease of the air port to Mr. McQueen for two years with option for three additional years on same basis as proposed to J. W. Marshall which was forfeited after August 31st last, with the exception that provision was reserved by the City for leasing a site to the Texas Forestry Association on which they might build air plane hangar have privilege of using the field for the service.
2. Further consideration of the application of K. Morris to have the Zone District changed on his property on Ellis Avenue near the City Limits was brought up and motion was made by Jas. A. Abney, second by B. F. Milligan that the Zoning Ordinance be not changed and the application be refused.
3. On call for vote by the Mayor, the following voted yea: Jas. A. Abney, B.F. Milligan and W.M. Glenn.
Voting Nay, R.E. Melvin and Arthur Temple, Jr., the Mayor declaring the Zoning District would remain as was.

Nothing further was presented for attention and the meeting adjourned.
